FOR the purpose of authorizing certain schools to remain eligible to participate in the
 Maryland Meals for Achievement In–Classroom Breakfast Program under certain
 circumstances; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation to the
 Program in the annual budget bill; defining certain terms; and generally relating to
 the Maryland Meals for Achievement In–Classroom Breakfast Program.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
