12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Education**

16 (a) There is a Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Program of Educational Excellence
17 Awards in this State that are awarded under this subtitle.

24 (a) Subject to subsection I(d)] (E) of this section, each recipient of a Delegate
25 Howard P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award shall:

26 (1) Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate program at an
27 eligible institution or be enrolled in a 2-year associate degree program in which the course
28 work is acceptable for transfer credit for an accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible
29 institution;

30 (2) Be a resident of this State;

31 (3) Demonstrate to the Office a definite financial need; and

32 (4) Accept any other conditions attached to the award.

1 (b) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION,
2 EACH recipient of a Guaranteed Access Grant shall:

3 (1) Have attained a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or its
4 equivalent at the end of the first semester of the senior year in high school and have
5 completed high school or, failing to do so, on the recommendation of the recipient's high
6 school principal, provide evidence satisfactory to the Office of extenuating circumstances;

7 (2) Begin college within 1 year of completing high school or, failing to do
8 so, provide evidence satisfactory to the Office of extenuating circumstances;

9 (3) Be under the age of 22 years at the time of receiving the first award;

10 (4) Have successfully completed a college preparatory program in high
11 school;

12 (5) Enroll in college as a full-time student;

13 (6) Subject to subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, have an annual family
14 income below a poverty index determined by the Commission; and

15 (7) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.

16 (c) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN
17 INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS SUCCESSFULLY OBTAINED A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA BY
18 EXAMINATION UNDER § 11-808 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE IS
19 EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

20 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
21 SUBSECTION IS ELIGIBLE FOR A GUARANTEED ACCESS GRANT IF THE INDIVIDUAL:

22 (I) HAS SCORED A PASSING SCORE OF AT LEAST 165 PER
23 MODULE ON THE DIPLOMA BY EXAMINATION;

24 (II) BEGINS COLLEGE WITHIN 1 YEAR OF ACHIEVING THE SCORE
25 DESCRIBED UNDER ITEM (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH OR, FAILING TO DO SO, PROVIDES
26 EVIDENCE SATISFACTORY TO THE OFFICE OF EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES;

27 (III) IS UNDER THE AGE OF 26 YEARS AT THE TIME OF RECEIVING
28 THE FIRST AWARD;

29 (IV) ENROLLS IN COLLEGE AS A FULL-TIME STUDENT; AND

4 **[(c)] (D)** To determine the annual family income eligibility of an applicant for a
5 Guaranteed Access Grant, the Office may not consider an amount received by the applicant
6 as an earned income credit under § 32 of the Internal Revenue Code.

7 I(d)] (E) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a student
8 in grade 7 or grade 8 who applies and qualifies for a Guaranteed Access Grant on the basis
9 of financial need as established by the Commission shall prequalify for a Guaranteed Access
10 Grant to be used at the time of enrollment in an institution of higher education by agreeing
11 in writing, as a secondary and undergraduate student, to:

12 (i) Satisfy the attendance policy of the applicable school;

13 (ii) Refrain from substance abuse;

14 (iii) Provide information required by the Commission or the State
15 Board of Education;

16 (iv) Apply for admission to an institution of higher education during
17 the student's senior year of high school;

(v) Complete and file on a timely basis applications for federal student aid for each year that the student plans to enroll in postsecondary education;

23 (vii) Maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 on a
24 4.0 scale or its equivalent; and

25 (viii) Satisfy any other program requirements set by the Office, the
26 Commission, the State Board of Education, or the State Department of Education.

27 (2) For academic years 2017–2018 and 2018–2019, a student in grade 9
28 who applies and qualifies for a Guaranteed Access Grant on the basis of financial need as
29 established by the Commission shall prequalify for a Guaranteed Access Grant to be used
30 at the time of enrollment in an institution of higher education if the student otherwise
31 meets the conditions of paragraph (1) of this subsection.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
33 as follows:

2 (c) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, an individual who has
3 successfully obtained a high school diploma by examination under § 11–808 of the Labor
4 and Employment Article is exempt from the requirements of subsection (b) of this section.

5 (2) An individual described under paragraph (1) of this subsection is
6 eligible for a Guaranteed Access Grant if the individual:

7 (i) Has scored a passing score of at least 165 per module on the
8 diploma by examination;

9 (ii) Begins college within 1 year of achieving the score described
10 under item (i) of this paragraph or, failing to do so, provides evidence satisfactory to the
11 Office of extenuating circumstances;

12 (iii) Is under the age of [26] 22 years at the time of receiving the first
13 award;

14 (iv) Enrolls in college as a full-time student; and

15 (v) Subject to subsection (d) of this section, has an annual family
16 income below a poverty index determined by the Commission.

17 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take
18 effect July 1, 2022.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in
20 Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
