CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – Newsprint Recycling Board – Repeal and Transfer of Authority**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing the provisions of law that establish the Newsprint Recycling
4 Board; authorizing the Secretary of the Environment, rather than the Board, to
5 exempt a publisher from certain recycled content requirements under certain
6 circumstances; providing that the Secretary's failure to act on a certain application
7 under certain circumstances, rather than the Board's failure to act, is an approval of
8 the application; requiring the Secretary, rather than the Board, to review certain
9 reports, comment on certain matters, and conduct certain activities to encourage
10 newsprint recycling; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the
11 Newsprint Recycling Board.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

Underlining indicates amendments to bill.

1 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 **Article – Environment**

3 9–1707.

4 (c) (1) To satisfy the recycled content percentage requirement of this section
5 for a reporting period, at least the percentage specified in paragraph (2) of this subsection,
6 by weight, of the total newsprint used by the publisher during that reporting period for
7 newspapers distributed in the State shall be recycled materials.

8 (2) The recycled content percentage requirement is:

9 (i) 12% for 1992;

10 (ii) 12% for 1993;

11 (iii) 20% for 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, and 1999;

12 (iv) 25% for 2000;

13 (v) 30% for 2001 and 2002;

14 (vi) 35% for 2003 and 2004; and

15 (vii) 40% for 2005 and all subsequent reporting periods.

16 (h) (1) [(i) There is a Newsprint Recycling Board in the Department.

17 (ii) The Newsprint Recycling Board shall meet only at the request of
18 the Secretary.

19 (2) The Newsprint Recycling Board is composed of 9 members appointed
20 by the Governor as follows:

21 (i) 2 shall be representatives of newspaper publishers appointed
22 from a list of at least 5 names submitted by the Maryland Delaware District of Columbia
23 Press Association;

24 (ii) 1 shall be a representative of the Northeast Waste Disposal
25 Authority;

26 (iii) 1 shall be a representative of the Maryland Environmental
27 Service;

28 (iv) 1 shall be a representative of local governments;

1 (v) 1 shall be a representative of the newspaper recycling
2 manufacturing industry;

3 (vi) 1 shall be a representative of an industry, other than an industry
4 that uses old newspapers; and

5 (vii) 2 shall be representatives of environmental groups with some
6 expertise in recycling.

7 (3) The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the Newsprint Recycling
8 Board from among the members.

9 (4) (i) The term of a member of the Newsprint Recycling Board is 3
10 years.

11 (ii) The terms of the members of the Newsprint Recycling Board are
12 staggered as required by the terms of the members of the Board serving on December 31,
13 1991.

14 (iii) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a
15 successor is appointed and qualifies.

16 (iv) A member of the Newsprint Recycling Board may not serve more
17 than two 3-year terms.

18 (v) The members of the Newsprint Recycling Board shall serve
19 without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable expenses incurred in the
20 performance of their duties.

21 (5) Upon] ON the application of a newspaper publisher, the [Newsprint
22 Recycling Board shall, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the members eligible to vote,
23 excuse] **SECRETARY MAY EXEMPT** the publisher of all or part of the recycled content
24 percentage requirements of this section for the newspaper publisher under such terms and
25 conditions and for such periods as the [Board] **SECRETARY** considers appropriate if the
26 [Board] **SECRETARY** determines, after taking into consideration the publisher's supply
27 contracts which existed as of March 15, 1990, that:

28 (i) The publisher could not obtain from manufacturers serving the
29 mid-Atlantic region an adequate supply of recycled newsprint comparable in quality to
30 virgin newsprint; and

31 (ii) The publisher has made a good faith effort to meet the recycled
32 content percentage requirements.

33 [(6)] (2) If the [Newsprint Recycling Board] **SECRETARY** fails to act on
34 an application for an [excuse] **EXEMPTION** of all or part of the recycled content percentage

1 requirements made under paragraph [(5)] (1) of this subsection within 45 days of the filing
 2 of the application with the [Board] SECRETARY, the application shall be deemed approved.

3 [(7)] (3) The [Newsprint Recycling Board] SECRETARY shall:

4 (i) Review the reports filed under subsection (e) of this section;

5 (ii) Analyze the availability and utilization of newsprint containing
 6 recycled material;

7 (iii) Comment on the appropriateness of the recycled content
 8 percentage requirements, including whether the requirements encourage manufacturers of
 9 virgin newsprint to convert to recycling;

10 (iv) Comment on the need for continuation of the provisions of this
 11 section and the impact the provisions of this section have on users of old newspapers for
 12 purposes other than producing newsprint;

13 (v) Work with municipalities and other collectors of old newspapers
 14 to develop a reliable system to provide a stable and quality supply of old newspapers for
 15 recycling;

16 (vi) Work to encourage the location of production facilities in the
 17 region to ensure an increase in the supply of recycled newsprint; and

18 (vii) Work to encourage the reuse of old newspapers.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 20 October 1, 2018.
