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State Real Estate Commission – Brokers – Business Succession in the Event of Disability

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain adult family members of a disabled real estate 5 broker to carry on the business of the disabled broker for a certain period of time for 6 certain purposes subject to certain qualifications; requiring certain family members 7 to surrender a certain certificate and pocket card and submit certain information to 8 the State Real Estate Commission under certain circumstances; requiring the 9 Commission to reissue certain licenses under certain circumstances; authorizing certain individuals to qualify for a certain license under certain circumstances; 10 11 authorizing certain licenses to be held for certain periods of time; requiring certain 12 individuals to renew a certain license under a certain provision of law; providing for 13 the automatic expiration of certain licenses under certain circumstances; and 14 generally relating to the succession of a business in the event of the disability of a 15 real estate broker.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Business Occupations and Professions

24 17–319.

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25 (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, on the **DISABILITY**

- 1 OR death of a licensed real estate broker, any adult member of the family of the DISABLED
- 2 OR deceased broker may carry on the business of the DISABLED OR deceased broker for up
- 3 to 6 months for the purposes of closing and terminating the business.
- 4 (b) To qualify to carry on the business of a **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate 5 broker, a family member shall:
- 6 (1) surrender the license certificate and pocket card of the **DISABLED OR** 7 deceased real estate broker to the Commission; and
- 8 (2) submit to the Commission any information or documentation required 9 by the Commission.
- 10 (c) (1) The Commission shall reissue the license of a **DISABLED OR** deceased 11 real estate broker to a family member who qualifies to carry on the business of the broker 12 under subsection (b) of this section.
- 13 (2) The term of the reissuance shall be 6 months.
- 14 (d) Before the end of the 6-month period for carrying on the business of a 15 **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate broker, an individual may qualify for the license of the 16 **DISABLED OR** deceased broker if:
- 17 (1) the individual is a member of the immediate family of the **DISABLED** 18 **OR** deceased broker;
- 19 (2) the individual has been continuously licensed as a real estate 20 salesperson for the immediately preceding 3 years;
- 21 (3) regardless of whether the individual has met the educational 22 requirements for a real estate broker license under § 17–305 of this subtitle, the individual 23 passes the real estate broker's examination under § 17–306 of this subtitle;
- 24 (4) the individual surrenders the real estate salesperson license certificate 25 and pocket card of the individual to the Commission; and
- 26 (5) there has been compliance with the requirements of subsection (b) of 27 this section.
- 28 (e) The Commission shall reissue the license of a **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate broker to an individual who qualifies for the license of the broker under subsection 30 (d) of this section.
- 31 (f) (1) An individual who qualifies for and is reissued the license of a 32 **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate broker may hold the license for up to 4 years from the 33 time of reissuance without meeting the educational requirements for a real estate broker

- 1 license under § 17–305 of this subtitle.
- 2 (2)Subject to the 4-year restriction under paragraph (1) of this subsection, 3 an individual who has been reissued the license of a DISABLED OR deceased real estate 4
 - broker is responsible for renewing the license as required under § 17–314 of this subtitle.
- 5 If an individual who has been reissued the license of a DISABLED OR
- 6 deceased real estate broker does not meet the educational requirements for a real estate
- 7 broker license within the 4-year period, the license shall expire automatically at the end of
- 8 that period.
- 9 **(4)** If an individual who has been reissued the license of a DISABLED OR
- 10 deceased real estate broker meets the educational requirements for a real estate broker
- license within the 4-year period, the individual may continue to hold the license and may 11
- 12 renew the license under § 17–314 of this subtitle.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
