A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Beach Erosion Control District - Ocean City Life-Saving Station Museum

 construction or placement of permanent structures within the Beach Erosion Control
 District under certain circumstances; making stylistic changes; and generally
 relating to construction in the Beach Erosion Control District.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Natural Resources

16 8–1102.

17(a) (1)Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, for the purposes of maintaining the Atlantic Coast beaches of the State and the 1819Beach Erosion Control District, the integrity and continuity of the dunal system and 20assuring adequate maintenance of the beaches, Beach Erosion Control District, and dunal 21system, to provide for shore erosion and sediment control and storm protection, and to 22minimize structural interference with the littoral drift of sand and any anchoring 23vegetation, any land clearing, construction activity, or the construction or placement of 24permanent structures within the Beach Erosion Control District is prohibited.

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(2) This prohibition does not apply to any project or activity approved by

16 required by all other applicable federal and local laws and regulations, it is approved by 17the Board of Public Works as essential to the public health, safety, and welfare of the 18citizens of Worcester County, after having received the permission of the Secretaries of the 19Environment and Natural Resources, and the Director of Planning, including a guarantee 20that in any contract under this provision a person will not make any significant permanent 21environmental disruption to the area, and the construction area for the purpose of laying a 22single pipe with a diameter not exceeding 36 inches is limited to a single 100 foot wide area 23perpendicular eastward from the west crest of the natural dune line on Assateague Island 24and in Ocean City, and if the Secretaries of the Environment and Natural Resources and 25the Director of Planning find that there is no economically and environmentally feasible 26alternative, and that there is insufficient capacity at the existing Ocean City wastewater 27treatment facility and discharge pipe; AND

(VI) THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADDITIONS AND ALTERATIONS TO THE EXISTING OCEAN CITY LIFE-SAVING STATION MUSEUM BUILDING, IF THE BUILDING AND ADDITIONS ARE OWNED BY OCEAN CITY.

(3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph, this prohibition
does not apply to the construction and installation of a qualified submerged renewable
energy line, as defined in § 7–208 of the Public Utilities Article, if the project does not result
in any significant permanent environmental damage to the Beach Erosion Control District,
as determined by the Department.

(ii) An application for a certificate of public convenience and
necessity to construct a qualified submerged renewable energy line, as defined in § 7–208
of the Public Utilities Article, is subject to review by the Department and the Department

1 of the Environment, as provided in § 3–306 of this article.

2 (iii) The Public Service Commission may not approve an application 3 for a qualified submerged renewable energy line to be constructed or installed within the 4 Assateague National Seashore Park or the Assateague State Park.

5 (b) The Secretary of the Environment, the Secretary of Natural Resources, and 6 the Director of Planning, with the approval of the Board of Public Works, shall jointly adopt 7 regulations in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article for the 8 purpose of implementing the provisions of this section.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2018.
