A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Social Services – Safe Harbor Child Trafficking Victim Service Pilot Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Safe Harbor Child Trafficking Victim Service Pilot 4 Program; providing for the purpose of the pilot program; requiring the local $\mathbf{5}$ departments of social services in Baltimore and Washington counties to implement 6 the pilot program; requiring certain local departments of social services to refer 7 certain children to the Regional Child Trafficking Advocate within a certain period 8 of time; requiring the Secretary of State, after consultation with certain entities, to 9 appoint certain Advocates; providing for the duties of an Advocate; requiring an Advocate to submit a certain report to certain entities on or before a certain date and 1011 at certain intervals thereafter; providing for the contents of a certain report; 12providing that an Advocate located in a certain county has certain duties; requiring 13 the Department of Human Services to provide certain funding to carry out the pilot 14 program; requiring the local departments of social services for certain counties to 15apply for certain grants for a certain purpose; defining a certain term; and generally 16relating to the Safe Harbor Child Trafficking Victim Service Pilot Program.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "ADVOCATE" MEANS THE COMMUNITY-BASED 2 AGENCY APPOINTED AS THE REGIONAL CHILD TRAFFICKING ADVOCATE IN 3 BALTIMORE COUNTY OR WASHINGTON COUNTY.

4 (B) THERE IS A SAFE HARBOR CHILD TRAFFICKING VICTIM SERVICE 5 PILOT PROGRAM.

(C) 6 THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO ADDRESS THE 7 SPECIALIZED NEEDS OF CHILDREN WHO ARE VICTIMS OF SEX TRAFFICKING BY 8 LINKING VICTIMS TO NECESSARY SUPPORT SERVICES THROUGH Α COMMUNITY-BASED AGENCY APPOINTED AS THE REGIONAL CHILD TRAFFICKING 9 10 ADVOCATE.

11 (D) (1) THE LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES IN BALTIMORE 12 COUNTY AND WASHINGTON COUNTY SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PILOT PROGRAM.

(2) THE LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES IN BALTIMORE
 COUNTY AND WASHINGTON COUNTY SHALL REFER A CHILD IDENTIFIED AS A
 VICTIM OF SEX TRAFFICKING TO THE ADVOCATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM WITHIN 24
 HOURS OF IDENTIFICATION.

17 (E) THE SECRETARY OF STATE, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE LOCAL 18 DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES AND THE WORK GROUP TO STUDY SAFE 19 HARBOR POLICY FOR YOUTH VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, SHALL APPOINT 20 THE ADVOCATE IN EACH COUNTY.

21 (F) THE ADVOCATE APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION 22 SHALL:

(1) RECEIVE REFERRALS OF CHILDREN IDENTIFIED AS VICTIMS OF
 SEX TRAFFICKING AND COMPLETE VICTIM ASSESSMENTS, SAFETY PLANNING, AND
 CRISIS INTERVENTION;

- 27 (I) DEVELOPING AN INITIAL COMPREHENSIVE SERVICE PLAN,
 28 INCLUDING APPROPRIATE SERVICE REFERRALS;

29 (II) VERIFYING A CHILD'S ELIGIBILITY FOR NECESSARY 30 SERVICES AND COORDINATING THE APPLICATION FOR AND PROVISION OF 31 SERVICES;

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(III) ENSURING THE CHILD'S ONGOING SAFETY AND ABILITY TO

2 (IV) PROVIDING PERSONAL SUPPORT TO CHILDREN UNDER THE 3 CASE MANAGEMENT OF THE ADVOCATE;

4 (3) ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF THE CHILD IN COMMUNICATIONS WITH 5 VARIOUS SERVICE PROVIDERS OR REGULATORY AGENCIES, INCLUDING CHILD 6 WELFARE, JUDICIAL, JUVENILE JUSTICE, LEGAL, EDUCATION, OR FEDERAL 7 IMMIGRATION AGENCIES;

8 (4) WORK TO ESTABLISH OUTREACH SERVICES TO SEX-TRAFFICKED 9 CHILDREN IN THE COMMUNITY, INCLUDING OUTREACH TO MARGINALIZED 10 POPULATIONS, INCLUDING MALES, TRANSGENDER CHILDREN, AND FOREIGN 11 NATIONALS;

12(5)PROVIDE TRAINING TO REGIONAL STAKEHOLDERS AND HUMAN13SERVICES PROFESSIONALS REGARDING EDUCATION ON SIGNS THAT A CHILD MAY BE14A VICTIM OF SEX TRAFFICKING AND SERVICES AVAILABLE TO CHILD VICTIMS; AND

15(6) PARTICIPATE IN LOCAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND SEX16TRAFFICKING TASK FORCES, COALITIONS, OR MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAMS.

17 (G) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2018, AND EVERY 90 DAYS 18 THEREAFTER, AN ADVOCATE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE WORK GROUP TO 19 STUDY SAFE HARBOR POLICY FOR YOUTH VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND 20 THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK CHILD SEX 21 TRAFFICKING INITIATIVE.

22 (2) THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 23 SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE:

24(I) THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN UNDER THE CASE25MANAGEMENT OF THE ADVOCATE AND THE GENDER, AGE, RACE, AND ETHNICITY OF26EACH CHILD;

(II) THE TYPES OF AND NUMBER OF CONTACTS FOR SERVICES
