5	FOR the purpose of prohibiting a hospital from discharging into certain temperatures a
6	patient that an employee of the hospital has reason to believe is suffering from an
7	emergency medical condition and lacks certain capacity to seek shelter, without
8	assistance, from certain temperatures; providing that a person who violates certain
9	provisions of this Act is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to
10	certain fines and penalties; authorizing, in addition to certain penalties, a person
11	who suffers an injury as a result of a person violating certain provisions of this Act
12	to recover certain damages from certain persons; making conforming changes;
13	defining certain terms; and generally relating to the discharge of patients with
14	emergency medical conditions into extreme outdoor temperatures.

[(c)] **(**D**)** 14 To facilitate discharge or transfer, the hospital shall: 15 (1) Assess a patient's needs; 16 Plan for discharge or transfer; (2) 17 Facilitate the discharge or transfer process; (3) 18 Give the patient or person responsible for providing continuing care to **(4)** 19 the patient written discharge instructions in a form the patient can understand; and 20 Help to ensure that continuity of care, treatment, and services is (5)21maintained. 22**(E)** A HOSPITAL MAY NOT DISCHARGE INTO **EXTREME OUTDOOR** 23 TEMPERATURES A PATIENT THAT AN EMPLOYEE OF THE HOSPITAL HAS REASON TO 24**BELIEVE:** 25**(1)** IS SUFFERING FROM AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL CONDITION; AND
- 26 (2) LACKS THE PHYSICAL OR MENTAL CAPACITY TO SEEK SHELTER, 27 WITHOUT ASSISTANCE, FROM THE EXTREME OUTDOOR TEMPERATURES.

- [(d)] (F) If a hospital fails to comply with the requirements of SUBSECTIONS (B), (C), OR (D) OF this section, the Secretary may impose a civil money penalty not to exceed \$10,000 for each failure to comply.
- 4 **[(e)] (G)** A hospital may appeal a civil money penalty imposed under subsection 5 **[(c)](D)** of this section in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government 6 Article.
- 7 (H) (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION IS 8 GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT 9 EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 90 DAYS OR BOTH.
- 10 (2) IN ADDITION TO THE PENALTIES SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF
  11 THIS SUBSECTION, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SUFFERED AN INJURY AS A RESULT OF A
  12 PERSON VIOLATING SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION MAY RECOVER CIVIL
  13 DAMAGES FROM THE PERSON AND FROM ANY OTHER PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY
  14 PARTICIPATED IN THE VIOLATION.
