## **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

Founded in 1981 by a cohort of Maryland State art leaders, Maryland Art Place (MAP) was established. MAP was created to support the work of living artists, from emerging to midcareer, by showing their work through exhibitions, performances, programming, and community events. For over 20 years MAP has maintained the Maryland State Artists Registry, which currently holds 1,947 artists profiles by curators, writers, collectors, and the general public. Initially MAP was peripatetic, but in 1986 it leased 218 West Saratoga St. with a purchase option, exercised two years later. Today MAP is an anchor for the visual arts on the gateway corridor of the Bromo Arts & Entertainment District, an area experiencing both opportunity and challenge as downtown economic development expands on Baltimores west side. MAP has been in operation for 36 years.

### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

A Bond Bill from the State will support building systems and infrastructure needs. MAP needs to completely replace 3 of its ten HVAC systems. Ideally all systems should be replaced. The HVAC systems are outdated and are not energy efficient. There is no heat or air on the 4th floor at present. MAP currently has 70 windows left to replace; all are over 25 years old, do not open and shut properly, and as a result, do not retain air and heat. Both the windows and the lack of appropriate HVAC pose safety concerns for MAP's tenants. In addition MAP must replace its front door and entry system. The doors are old, glass and not energy efficient. The lock system is old and safety remains a concern. Ultimately the doors would be completely replaced and a digital entry system installed for the tenants. The purpose of this project is to stabilize the infrastructure of the building so MAP may retain is current tenants, and attract new tenants.

### 28. Comments

MAPs Bond Bill request is multi-faceted. The core of MAPs request lays in the need to create a safe, secure building for its creative professional tenants and community visitors. Energy inefficiency remains an issue as well, and MAP seeks to make its facility and systems more safe, reliable, and affordable. When MAP first returned back to Saratoga Street in 2014, the building was mostly vacant with the exception of two small studio rentals. Today MAP is a thriving hub for the visual and performing arts. A Bond Bill will help MAP improve its capacity for organizational stability and growth, but also positively impact the existing businesses and artists in the building.

Assistance from the State of Maryland will follow investments already made by many community partners over the past three years. Those partners/supporters are (non-individual): The Downtown Partnership of Baltimore City, The France Merrick Foundation, The Bank of America Foundation, The William G. Memorial Baker Fund, The Bunting Family Foundation, The Shelter Foundation, the Abell Foundation, The Helen Pumphey Denit Trust, T. Rowe Price Foundation, The Meyerhoff Family/Baltimore Community Foundation, The Good Hope Foundation, The Cordish Family Fund, The Rothschild Charitable Foundation, and The Jacob S. Shapiro Foundation. (Government: Maryland State Arts Council and the Baltimore County Commission on the Arts & Sciences)

Anecdotal: Over the past few years MAP has experienced several break-ins and lost its entire PA system. The alley next to MAP, often traversed by visitors, also attracts a homeless population, drug trade, and squatting; there was a mugging in the alley this year. MAP is presently working with the Downtown Partnership to produce a permanent public art project to illuminate the alley. A vibrant mural will be added and the entire project will serve two goals: 1) safety and 2) a point of destination. The alley project is anticipated to be unveiled during Light City spring of 2018 and is preliminarily approved at \$35,000.
