The Ranch is a residential substance abuse treatment facility for adult men ages 18 and over. We provide a III.1 residential facility with II.1 Intensive Outpatient Therapy. We provide individual, group and family counseling, along with daily support group meetings and life skill classes. We also provide educational classes for family members. After men complete our IOP (2.1 level of care), they transition to a lower level of care and less structured environment. We are hoping to use the bond bill to renovate our building so men can move into this house to have continued structure and accountability and they will also be able to continue getting treatment with The Ranch. It is proven that people who stay in a structured setting that provides treatment are less likely to relapse.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

We need to renovate one of our residential cottages. This will include demolition of interior items (doors, carpeting and tile floors, bathrooms, furnace, light fixtures, fire alarm panel & smoke detectors), installation of new doors and hardware, bathroom vanities, counter tops, caulking, replacement windows, new carpeting and tile, ada-compliant bathrooms, replacement of toilets, showers, faucets, replace of two oil-fired furnaces, and two natural-gas fired furnaces, upgrade fire alarm panel, replace smoke detectors, replace fire extinguishes, design fees and building permits, exterior lighting, insulation replacement, cabinets, panic bars, gutters, paint, fascia and other miscellaneous items.
