<p>Unified Efforts, Inc. a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) organization is dedicated to providing a community-based approach supporting vulnerable children, boys and girls - ages 5-17, to avoid violence, stay in school, and become leaders in their community and productive citizens as they grow up. To do this, Unified Efforts provides free after school and out of school-time programming, including (A) alternatives to violence programming; (B) programs to encourage civic leadership and community development; (C) programs to introduce and explore new career paths, (D) academic improvement programming and assistance; (E) athletic, cultural and recreational activities, and (F) family engagement with home visits (sustainable relationships) activities to promote good relationships between youth, and their local communities.</p>

Unified Efforts, Inc. seek to build a facility in one of Baltimore's historic communities: Penn-North. Unified Efforts, Inc. introduces children to civic leaders by providing programs and events for children to meet with community association leaders, elected officials, and cultural leaders to learn what leaders contribute to the community, value their history, and inspire children to become tomorrow's leaders and activists for change for the betterment of society at large. Classes will be provided from kindergarten through completion of high school. Our program connects children to opportunities to learn about advocacy, and development skills to build strong relationships between children and community. Children receive instruction in gang prevention, are offered compelling alternatives to involvement in crime activity and violence, including fun and free after school, out of school time summer camps, family programs, public events, and mindfulness activities. Our programs intend to build character and survival skills in the involved children so they can avoid bullying and reduce the chances that they will participate in gang activity or drop out of school. We are dedicated in providing a place and space where children know that this was designed specifically for them to further their development into adulthood. Unified Efforts's founder is fully aware of the necessity in helping children with successful conflict resolutions, reduction in crime and a place where they can do their homework with our state of the art computer lab, development their talents, involve themselves with our STE(A)M engineering, arts, science, math and technology programs. Baltimore, MD has the largest bio-tech lab in the world with Johns Hopkins to the east and University of MD to the west - our children are poised to have substantial jobs waiting for them upon their high school and college completion. Unified Efforts is one of those programs that understands and share their vision of becoming successful in life.

Unified Efforts, Inc. has successfully provided free out of school time well structured and meaningful programs and activities to the Penn-North and surrounding West Baltimore neighborhoods for the past three years. Founded by former Baltimore City Police Detective and Community Police Officer. Recipient of City of Baltimore's Mayor Citation for contributions to the civic welfare of Baltimore City - MD.

The program provides opportunities to involve the local community in improving the lives of children by establishing positive attitudes to all members of the children's local community. The program includes events where children and members of their community meet and get to know one another, publishing news about positive contributions to the community.

For the past three years our students have been recognized as "Police Commissioner for the Day" and "Fire Chief for the Day" for their violence prevention contributions. This capital project will fill in the community's void after loosing their Westside Elementary School. We will be a safe haven for the children to meet, complete their academic responsibilities, until picked up by their parents/primary care providers.
