10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)								

It has been the mission of the Pocomoke Little League to implant firmly in the children of the community the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and respect for authority, so that they may be well adjusted, stronger and happier children and will grow to be good, decent, healthy and trustworthy citizens. Pocomoke Little League serves over 120 children annually in the Pocomoke City and surrounding areas.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of this project is to install lighting on our main field to increase player safety, increase player participation, increase inter-leaguing, and allow for full games to be played. Our league is driven by the help of volunteers, most of whom have full-time jobs, meaning our games do not begin until 6 pm. During most of our season, early sunsets cut games short. Often, we can only get 3-4 innings completed before games are called for darkness. As it is, we are continuously concerned about the safety of our players as we try to complete an inning with impending darkness. As a result of this, our league has been seriously hampered. Several local leagues no longer inter-league with us because their parents do not want to invest in travel time for a shortened game. We are also currently in danger of not meeting the Little League International requirement for games. This means our kids could be disqualified for all-stars.

28. Comments

We understand matching funds are generally required for bond bills. We ask that our grant request as an unequal match be approved based on exigent circumstances. We feel that our situation is unique due to the small area of our league and our need for this project. The safety of our children is paramount. We would love to contribute more funds towards this project however providing scholarships to underprivileged youth is more of a necessity. Approximately 70% of children in our town receive free or reduced lunch. Our league celebrated 50 years of involvement in youth sports in 2017. Unfortunately the league will not be able to continue our efforts fully and effectively without this lighting. Children are losing interest when games are cut short due to darkness. New baseball rules on resuming suspended games due darkness and weather will now place more restrictions on our youth. So it is extremely important that we be able to finish our games safely.

Adding lights will help not only the Little League but it will also help the community economically. We are constantly striving to find ways to keep costs down and help more local children, many of whom fall below the poverty line, play baseball. Adding lights would enable us to host tournaments or have our fields used as overflow in tournaments held elsewhere which would also help increase our profits. There are several tournaments around that would love to use our facility for weekend tournaments. Finally, with lights we would also be able to put in a bid for the Maryland State Little League Tournament the next time were eligible. That will be a huge impact for the entire area.

Local Fundraising:

Several attempts have been made to raise the funds needed locally however it is just not possible. Through hard work we have managed to get several thousands of dollars in work donated towards our project. This partnership with local businesses and contractors is allowing us to complete the project at a reduced price. The only way we can complete this project is with your help. We have been denied grants from several local foundations. We have also been denied program open space funds as they're already allocated to other projects.

Economic Impact:

Lighting will allow Pocomoke Little League as well as Worcester County to increase revenue by increasing the amount of kids playing, parents visiting the fields and spending money at local establishments and sporting goods stores. It will also bring in outside revenue in the form of tournaments outside of the regular season.

Divisions of Benefit:

The field selected for lighting install is the main field at our complex and is the most centrally located for all fields, concession stand, bathrooms etc. This field allows children from t-ball through majors to have a place to play to maximize the usage of the lights. Additionally, tournaments will be played on this field increasing the amount of children who benefit from the lighting. Finally, the league hosts several free community movie nights at the ball park on the main field. Lighting would allow for safer means of entry and exit for guest as the park can be very dark at night time.
