### **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

St. Elizabeth School is a nonpublic special education school serving students ages 6 thru 21 years (grades 1 thru 12) who are challenged with intellectual, physical, and/or emotional disabilities such as Autism, Down Syndrome, and Cerebral Palsy. Students are placed at SES by ten local school systems who partner with the school because it is equipped to provide the highly specialized education and therapeutic services these students need. SES integrates academics, supportive and related services, as well as training in social, vocational and independent living skills. Seventy-three SES students now use Assistive Technology (AT) devices to help them communicate and 18 of our students have severe mobility challenges and require Physical Therapy as part of their IEPs.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

St. Elizabeth School (SES) is looking to renovate its main entranceway and lobby area in order to make it fully ADA Compliant, which it is not currently. The new entranceway will be redesigned for safety with a heated check-in area outside of the school so that guests are properly vetted prior to entering the building. The main vestibule will contain two wider, handicap-accessible entrance doors that is compatible with the alarm system. Three restrooms located in the lobby area will become handicap-accessible. One restroom will contain a Rifton toileting system for severely handicapped students to easily and hygienically access toileting. SES serves students from ten Maryland jurisdictions (ages 6-21), challenged with intellectual, emotional, and/or physical disabilities. It is imperative that these students are safe and have access to an ADA compliant learning environment.

#### 28. Comments

St. Elizabeth School is a nonpublic, co-educational, 11-month day school for students with a variety of special needs who are diagnosed with a wide range of disabilities, including: autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disability, traumatic brain injury (TBI), emotional disability, and multiple disabilities which may include a combination of the following: orthopedic impairment, speech or language impairment, or other health impairment including ADD, ADHD and specific learning disability.

Students are placed at St. Elizabeth School by ten local school systems that partner with the school because it is equipped to provide the highly specialized education and therapeutic services these students need. The children are challenged with intellectual, physical, and/or emotional disabilities such as Autism, Downs Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, and Traumatic Brain Injury.

The main entrance and lobby are not ADA compliant. Parents have urgently requested that our lobby be more accessible to those in wheelchairs or having mobility challenges.

Seventy-three SES students now use Assistive Technology (AT) devices to help them communicate and 18 of our students have severe mobility challenges and require Physical Therapy as part of their IEPs.

St. Elizabeth School is located in the Northeast District of Baltimore where the violent crime rate on a scale from 1 (low crime) to 100, is 77. The US average is 31.1. [Source: www.bestplaces.net]

Emergency evacuations for a special needs school are much more complicated and challenging than one for a public school. SES students are some of the most vulnerable.

The new vestibule will add an extra layer of safety precautions (a new heated vestibule will allow guests to be properly vetted prior to entering the building).

The new lobby will also be redesigned with LED, energy-efficient lighting; a showcase area to exhibit student-made products that are for sale; and a digital monitor to display schoolwide announcements.
