11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

TPCS will acquire, rehabilitate, and repurpose a long-vacant building at 6530 New Hampshire Ave, for the purposes of growing our school to reach a larger community of families with children aged 2 through 8 with expanded hours, after school care, summer and school holiday programming to meet the needs of the community. It will serve as a hub of educational excellence, providing training and mentorship for local area public and independent school teachers, parents, caregivers, and teen and college aged students. The rehabilitation of the now-derelict building, consistent with TPCNS' practice of ecological stewardship, will establish the property as a flagship of redevelopment along the New Hampshire Ave corridor -- improving public safety, aesthetics, and business opportunity in this neglected area.

28. Comments

The schools current strategic plan recognizes that it must evolve to meet the changing landscape of family needs in order to remain the vibrant organization it has been for 75 years. We currently offer a half day education program for 2/3, 3 /4 and 4/5 year old children and no before and after daycare program. Parent expectations are also changing as they seek extended day programs for their children, and TPCS is experiencing strong demand for expanded programming. TPCS vision for the future involves expanding its services by offering both a daycare program and early elementary education (K-3), with after school, summer and school holiday programming offered at affordable rates due to the efficiencies realized by the cooperative school model.

Generally, families who attended TPCS reside in Montgomery County, MD and continue after TPCS to Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS). Based on the data above, total MCPS enrollment has risen 23% between 1999/2000 to 2017/18, which matches the time TPCS has been located at 8204 Flower Ave, with its extremely limited space capacity for students. MCPS forecast suggests population growth will continue. Kindergarten enrolment forecast for MCPS is projected to increase 2.4% annually.

All of these trends indicate that demand for high quality, evidence-based education in Montgomery and bordering Prince Georges' county will continue to grow. The tuition rates TPCS plans to enact will be among the bottom 25% of independent schools in the area, allowing it to reach a diverse cross-section of the community.

At the same time, its world-renowned curriculum TPCS has developed over its 75 year history will deepen its capacity to impact and lead teachers, parents and other educational stakeholders in the development of evidence-based curricula through the use of targeted nature, arts and play based strategies to boost literacy, science, technology and math learning.

Governor Hogan's executive order 01.01.2017.12 establishes "Project Green Classrooms" -- an initiative to promote outdoor experiential activities and environmental education through Marylands schools, communities and public lands. TPCS has been leading in outdoor and environmental education since its inception, with its valued forest pre-kindergarten program. Rehabilitating and "greening" the currently vacant eyesore at 6530 will turn what is essentially an unused parking lot into a vanguard site of outdoor education serving the urban/suburban children of southern Maryland. This rehabilitation will benefit not only the children who attend our school and afterschool and summer programs, but also the larger community who will enjoy a safer, more beautiful, and more prosperous New Hampshire Ave corridor.
