10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Vehicles for Change Inc. (VFC) empowers families with financial challenges to achieve economic and personal independence through car ownership and technical training. Car Awards: Repairing and providing donated cars to qualified families for employment purposes. Since 1999, VFC has awarded cars to more than 6,000 low-income families, changing the lives of more than 21,000 people. 75% boosted earnings an ave \$7,000 in the first year, while taking children to after-school, athletic and recreational activities never before possible. Training: The automotive repair training program serves individuals recently released from prison who to be mechanics. The program is an employer driven, social enterprise, paid apprenticeship with unprecedented success: 100% placement rate; \$16.25 ave starting salary; 2 percent recidivism rate and 100% retention thru 20 months.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This funds generated from the bond bill will be used to replace the roof on the facility at 4111 Washington Avenue and to add solar panels. The roof is a ruberized roof that was experimental when it was installed many years ago. VFC recently refinanced the building through Bay Bank and in the building inspection it was noted that the roof has less than a 5 year life. The roof has been in constant repair since we purchased the building 6 years ago. It is still leaking in several areas. In addition, VFC would install solar panels on the roof but the roof must be replaced prior to the panels being installed. VFC when possible is a very green organization. The repair shop is heated with 2 waste oil heaters. The solar panels will help to decrease our carbon footprint even more as well as save the organization approximately \$1,500-\$2,000 per month. The solar panels would be designed and installed by another local nonprofit Power52.
