### 10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Founded in 1981, the Baltimore Museum of Industry (BMI) celebrates Maryland's industrial legacy and shows how innovation fuels ongoing progress. Through exhibition, educational programs, and collections, BMI engages visitors in the stories of the people who built Baltimore and shaped the region's future. Driven by the goal of providing the community with the best educational experience possible, BMI has grown into a major cultural institution on Baltimore's Inner Harbor. Each year the museum serves more than 170,000 visitors, roughly half of whom are students, teachers, and chaperones who benefit from our award-winning curriculum-based educational programs. Thousands of BMI visitors also take advantage of our rotating schedule of public programs and special events, Maryland Engineering Challenges, and a full catalog of technology education training courses.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Baltimore Museum of Industry (BMI) proposes to undertake a major capital project to repair, repaint, and preserve the World War II era Bethlehem Steel shipyard crane located at its campus on Baltimore's Inner Harbor. As with any outdoor artifact, decades of exposure to the elements have taken their toll and the crane's longevity is today threatened. Beginning in Summer 2018, this project will remedy the most highly visible and structurally critical issues confronting this 110-ton artifact. Specifically, BMI proposes to replace the crane's deteriorated structural hardware with new rust-resistant galvanized components, strip and sandblast the entire structure, and apply a new weather-resistant industrial paint system. Once complete, this project will provide a marked improvement to the stability and appearance of the crane, thus making it safely available to continue telling the story of Baltimore's contribution to the nation's maritime and industrial heritage.
