Nonprofit Village is the only co-working space in the DC region dedicated to nonprofits.We strengthen their effectiveness through shared space, essential services and collaborative opportunities.While charitable organizations are incubated, they become sustainable, increase their capacity and focus on their mission. Our educational programs, tools, resources, innovative and comprehensive professional development, and amenities help charities operate efficiently and effectively. Our values include community, collaboration, sustainability, integrity, impact. Our impact includes: * 45 members incubated since 2008 * 31% hiring increase since 2012 * 134 nonprofits served annually * 88,000+ citizens served each year * \$7,000 yearly savings per member * 32 current nonprofit members incubated * 0 nonprofits have failed while incubated at Nonprofit Village

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Nonprofit Village builds the infrastructure of nonprofits through shared space and essential services. Our incubator provides structured support to nonprofits in the region that need operational efficiencies and improved programmatic outcomes. We are the administrative office of 32 nonprofits. Our members choose from offices or community co-working space, use onsite meeting rooms, enjoy back office IT and development services, and participate in group and individualized educational programs. The broader nonprofit sector can take advantage of programs and co-working space as well as rent meeting rooms. After 10 years of service, we have reached our limit on space and amenities, requiring additional space for more nonprofits onsite in the proposed space, thereby continuing to add to the sustainability of the sector.

The Nonprofit Village is more than an affordable co-working space; it provides the professional, collaborative atmosphere that helps nonprofits succeed. The peer networking and education make our operation unique, and member surveys consistently point to the collaborative environment as part of the key to their success. Being able to walk the halls or send an email to the group about common experiences is a tremendous help to nonprofit leaders. Nonprofit Village staff help facilitate partnerships among members and we provide the essential equipment and some of the back-office technology needed to help organizations grow. We also provide three meeting rooms to our members at no cost, and to the larger nonprofit community at a reduced rate, saving organizations more than \$40,000 each year.

By alleviating operational pressure, the Nonprofit Village helps organizations focus on their mission. Our partners include Maryland Nonprofits, the Center for Nonprofit Advancement, Foundation Center, Catalogue for Philanthropy, Nonprofit Montgomery, Montgomery College, and Thriving Germantown. Our programs include:

* Nonprofit Business Accelerator focusing on six critical areas of operational expertise that provides individualized professional development, coaching, and measurable results;

* Masters Series training on integrated fundraising and revenue diversification;

* Duck Pond is a pitch event for start-up nonprofits with experts in marketing, fundraising, legal, program development and strategic planning to offer feedback for starting a new charity;

* Learn@Lunch Series consists of targeted briefings on topics that are common to members needs;

* Fiscal Agent services for start up nonprofits.

Memberships include: Individual offices and shared co-working space; Free Wi-Fi and discounted high-speed Internet; Back office technology services; Complimentary access to the Foundation Center library databases; Webinars, short- and long-term training, scholarships, capacity building memberships; Peer networking; Consultant referrals; Volunteer recruitment; Subsidized summer internships.
