10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The grantee organization is the Town of Perryville, a Maryland Municipal Corporation. Perryville was incorporated in 1882 and has a Mayor and Commissioner Form of government. As a local government, Perryville's purpose is to provide a range of services to residents, businesses and visitors, including, among others, Parks and Recreation. One of Perryvilles goals in providing services is to ensure a vibrant and thriving community while maintaining a quaint small-town feel. The Railroad Monument Sign project includes mounting the original Pennsylvania Railroad 1918 date stone and providing a plaque with the history of the railroad in Perryville. This will support Perryvilles purpose and goals by memorializing the history of the railroad industry in Perryville at a new Town park where the railroad once had a base of operations.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Perryville plans to mount a Pennsylvania Railroad (PRR) 1918 date stone and provide a plaque with the history of the railroad in Perryville. The date stone is large and will be mounted between columns. The overall dimensions of the sign will be 12 ft long x 5 ft high x 2 ft deep. On one side will be an 18 in x 20 in bronze plaque engraved with railroad history. The monument sign will be located on a new Town park that was the original location of the railroad roundhouse and of the date stone. Perryville previously, and unsuccessfully, sought funding for this project. It is the 100-year anniversary of the PRR in Perryville, so we hope to get the sign funded and built this year. The railroad roundhouse is no longer there, but the town desires to memorialize the history of the railroad in Perryville at this strategic location. We estimate that the park has 3,000 visitors annually, though as a new park, we expect that number to grow as we hold more festivals there.

28. Comments

It may be helpful for you to know a little bit about the history of the site and date stone. By the early 1900's Perryville, Maryland had grown to become an important railroad transportation hub, linking East-West rail lines with North-South lines. To accommodate this traffic a large freight yard was established along the shore of the Susquehanna River, a second yard was situated on the south side of the main Pennsylvania R.R. line.

During this period the Pennsylvania Railroad was the largest business enterprise in the town and a dynamic engine of Perryville's economic growth. The freight yard contained a large roundhouse and a shop building. These were situated on land that the Town of Perryville now owns and has established a park on.

The roundhouse was demolished when the steam engines were replaced with diesel and electric locomotives, and the shop was demolished and the rail lines removed in the mid 1980's to prepare the land for sale by Amtrak.

The town was given a large Pennsylvania Railroad date stone with the 1918 date on the stone. It is all that is now left of a very important piece of Perryville and Railroading history, which we wish to preserve.

In 2003 Perryville acquired the property where the roundhouse was once located, primarily with Program Open Space funding. Between 1998 and 2017, the parkland was an undeveloped field, though it was used for the Town's Farmers Market and occasional festivals. In 2017, the Town substantially completed development of a park on the site. The park was developed through a combination of Town sources, MHAA and DNR Community Parks and Playgrounds funding. Perryville is working on revitalizing the downtown area, yet its goal while doing so is to preserve the character of the community, protect historic structures and promote heritage tourism. This park is an important part of Perryville's revitalization efforts, and mounting this date stone as a monument sign with a plaque detailing the history of the area is a great way to meet the stated goal.
