10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The Discovery Center on the Pocomoke River serves as a source of learning and discovery for the public through the preservation and interpretation of its cultural and natural heritage. We are a hands-on and interactive center for learning about the cultural and natural environments on the Eastern Shore. We are open 361 days a year and specialize in field trips, senior tours, scouts and multi-generational guests. Inside the 16,000 square foot building is a 60' Steamship, STEAM Classroom and Lab, River Otter Exhibit with a 6,000 gallon aquarium, and a Touch Tank with four wheelchair stations. We are working very hard to be as universally inclusive as possible.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The City of Pocomoke voted unanimously to allow us to make this request as a Co-Applicant with them (since they own our building). The purpose of the funds is to leverage a donation from Perdue Farms to build an exceptional Agriculture and Farming Exhibit. State funds, couple with major donors, has allowed the Discovery Center to build better exhibits that are more universally accessible. We have become a regional tourist destination and are open 361 days a year. This new Agriculture Exhibit is being fast tracked in order to be complete in time for the National Folk Festival which will be held in Salisbury September 7-9. We are preparing for many more tourists to begin exploring more of the State in the spill-over effect. This new Exhibit will be universally accessible and our first bi-lingual Exhibit. There will be many aspects that will be hands-on and interactive.
