<u>AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 883</u> (First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 19, after "membership" insert "<u>of the advisory board</u>"; and strike beginning with "altering" in line 20 down through "Board;" in line 21.

On page 2, in line 22, strike "9–3203(a)" and substitute "<u>9–3207(e)</u>"; and strike in their entirety lines 30 through 32, inclusive.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 15 through 17, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 30 on page 15 through line 9 on page 17, inclusive, and substitute:

"<u>9–3207.</u>

(e) (1) The Board shall establish an advisory board for the purpose of including stakeholders in the criminal justice system in the analysis of the implementation of justice reinvestment initiatives.

(2) The Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention shall appoint members of the advisory board, subject to the approval of the chair of the Board.

(3) <u>Members of the advisory board shall include:</u>

(i) <u>a representative of the exclusive representative of the</u> <u>employees of the Division of Parole and Probation;</u>

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(ii) <u>a representative of the National Association for the</u> <u>Advancement of Colored People;</u>

- (iii) <u>a representative of CASA de Maryland;</u>
- (iv) <u>a representative of the American Civil Liberties Union;</u>

(v) the chair of the Criminal Law and Practice Section of the Maryland State Bar Association or the chair's designee;

- (vi) <u>a representative of victims of domestic violence;</u>
- (vii) <u>a representative of victims of sexual assault;</u>

(viii) <u>a representative with clinical experience and expertise in</u> <u>behavioral health and criminal justice;</u>

(ix) <u>a representative of the Maryland Retailers Association;</u>

(x) <u>a representative of an organization whose mission is to</u> <u>develop and advocate for policies and programs to increase the skills, job opportunities,</u> <u>and incomes of low-skill, low-income workers and job seekers;</u>

(xi) <u>a representative of an organization whose mission is to</u> <u>advocate for ex-offenders; [and]</u>

(xii) <u>a representative of the Maryland Chamber of Commerce</u>;

(XIII) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A COMMUNITY ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE; AND

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(XIV) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A COMMUNITY ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE.".

On pages 17 and 18, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 25 on page 17 through line 3 on page 18, inclusive.
