1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Farms and Families Fund – Purpose, Use, Funding, and Grant Qualifications – Alterations

- FOR the purpose of altering the purpose and use of the Maryland Farms and Families
 Fund; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation to the Fund in the
 annual budget bill each fiscal year, beginning in a certain fiscal year; providing that
 the appropriation is in addition to certain other funding for a certain division in the
 Department of Agriculture; altering certain qualifications for certain nonprofit
 organizations to receive a certain grant from the Fund; making stylistic changes; and
 generally relating to the Maryland Farms and Families Fund.

 General Fund] AN appropriation OF \$500,000 \$100,000 to the Fund [of \$500,000 for each

- 8 (1) The names and locations of Maryland farmers markets that received 9 funds under the Program;
- 10 (2) The dollar amount of funds awarded to each participating farmers 11 market;
- 12 (3) The dollar amount of FMNP, SNAP, and WIC benefits, and funds 13 provided under the Program that were spent at participating farmers markets, as well as 14 any unspent funds;
- 15 (4) The number of FMNP, SNAP, and WIC transactions carried out at 16 participating farmers markets; and
- 17 (5) The impact of the Program on increasing the quantity of fresh fruits 18 and vegetables consumed by FMNP, SNAP, and WIC families, as determined by customer 19 surveys.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 21 1, 2019.
