CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Sale or Display of Obscene Item to Minor – Video Image**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “item” as it relates to a certain prohibition
4 against selling or displaying a certain obscene item to a minor; defining a certain
5 term; and generally relating to sale or display of an obscene item to a minor.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Criminal Law**

14 11–203.

15 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

16 (2) “Distribute” includes to rent.

17 (3) “Illicit sex” means:

- 1 (i) human genitals in a state of sexual stimulation or arousal;
- 2 (ii) acts of human masturbation, sexual intercourse, or sodomy; or
- 3 (iii) fondling or other erotic touching of human genitals.

4 **(4) "IMAGE" INCLUDES:**

5 **(I) A TWO-DIMENSIONAL IMAGE;**

6 **(II) A THREE-DIMENSIONAL IMAGE; AND**

7 **(III) A HOLOGRAPHIC IMAGE.**

8 ~~(4)~~ **(5)** "Item" means a:

- 9 (i) still **OR MOTION** picture, **IMAGE, VISUAL REPRESENTATION,**
- 10 or photograph;
- 11 (ii) book, pocket book, pamphlet, or magazine;
- 12 (iii) videodisc, videotape, video game, **VIDEO FILE, VIDEO IMAGE,**
- 13 **VIDEO RECORDING,** film, or computer disc; or
- 14 (iv) recorded telephone message.

15 ~~(5)~~ **(6)** "Obscene" means:

- 16 (i) that the average adult applying contemporary community
- 17 standards would find that the work, taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest;
- 18 (ii) that the work depicts sexual conduct specified in subsection (b)
- 19 of this section in a way that is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult
- 20 community as a whole with respect to what is suitable material; and
- 21 (iii) that the work, taken as a whole, lacks serious artistic,
- 22 educational, literary, political, or scientific value.

23 ~~(6)~~ **(7)** "Partially nude figure" means a figure with:

- 24 (i) less than completely and opaquely covered human genitals, pubic
- 25 region, buttocks, or female breast below a point immediately above the top of the areola; or
- 26 (ii) human male genitals in a discernibly turgid state, even if
- 27 completely and opaquely covered.

1 (b) (1) A person may not willfully or knowingly display or exhibit to a minor
2 an item:

3 (i) the cover or content of which is principally made up of an obscene
4 description or depiction of illicit sex; or

5 (ii) that consists of an obscene picture of a nude or partially nude
6 figure.

7 (2) A person may not willfully or knowingly engage in the business of
8 displaying, exhibiting, selling, showing, advertising for sale, or distributing to a minor an
9 item:

10 (i) the cover or content of which is principally made up of an obscene
11 description or depiction of illicit sex; or

12 (ii) that consists of an obscene picture of a nude or partially nude
13 figure.

14 (3) If a newsstand or other place of business is frequented by minors, the
15 owner, operator, franchisee, manager, or an employee with managerial responsibility may
16 not openly and knowingly display at the place of business an item whose sale, display,
17 exhibition, showing, or advertising is prohibited by paragraph (2) of this subsection.

18 (c) The provision of services or facilities by a telephone company under a tariff
19 approved by the Public Service Commission is not a violation of subsection (b) of this section
20 relating to recorded telephone messages.

21 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction
22 is subject to:

23 (1) for a first violation, imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not
24 exceeding \$1,000 or both; and

25 (2) for each subsequent violation, imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a
26 fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 2019.
