FOR the purpose of making a certain applicant eligible for senatorial and delegate
scholarships if the applicant is eligible for certain in-State tuition; and generally

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

7	(i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Office; and
8 9	(ii) 1. Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate, graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or
10 11 12	2. Be enrolled in a 2-year terminal certificate program in which the course work is acceptable for transfer credit for an accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible institution.
13	(2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:

29 30 31 32	(3) A private career school within the State that is approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11–202 of this article and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education.

1 (c) Money appropriated to the Commission for scholarships awarded under this 2 section that are not used by the end of the fiscal year shall be retained by the Commission 3 for use by the awarding Delegate in the Delegate Scholarship Program during subsequent 4 fiscal years.

6 (A) Each member of the House of Delegates may select the recipients of the 7 scholarships on any basis that the Delegate considers appropriate.

8 (B) A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES MAY SELECT ANY 9 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR IN-STATE TUITION UNDER THIS ARTICLE AS A 10 RECIPIENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP.
