- 5 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law that limit the number and location 6 of speed monitoring systems that may be placed and used on Maryland Route 210 7 (Indian Head Highway) in Prince George's County; authorizing the placement and 8 use of speed monitoring systems at any intersection increasing the number of speed 9 monitoring systems that may be placed on Maryland Route 210 in Prince George's 10 County; requiring the State Highway Administration, in conjunction with the Prince George's County Department of Public Works and Transportation, to perform a 11 certain examination of Maryland Route 210 and report certain findings and 12 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 13 date; making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to the placement 14 and use of speed monitoring systems on Maryland Route 210 (Indian Head Highway) 15 in Prince George's County. 16


