CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Nursing – Criminal History Records Checks – Certified Nursing
 Assistants and Certified Medication Technicians Revised Statement

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain applicants for certification as a medication technician 5 by the State Board of Nursing to submit to a certain criminal history records check: 6 requiring the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository of the 7 Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to provide a revised criminal 8 history record to the Board under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to 9 require a certain criminal history records check for certain applicants for 10 certification and for certain former certified medication technicians who file for 11 reinstatement; requiring the Board to require certain certified medication technicians to obtain a certain criminal history records check as a condition of a 12 certain certificate renewal; providing for the application of this Act; and generally 13 relating to criminal history records checks for eertified nurses and nursing assistants 14 and certified medication technicians. 15

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 3 (a) In this section, "Central Repository" means the Criminal Justice Information 4 System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.
- 5 (b) As part of an application to the Central Repository for a State and national 6 criminal history records check, an applicant shall submit to the Central Repository:
- 7 (1) Two complete sets of legible fingerprints taken on forms approved by 8 the Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal Bureau of 9 Investigation;
- 10 (2) The fee authorized under § 10–221(b)(7) of the Criminal Procedure 11 Article for access to State criminal history records; and
- 12 (3) The processing fee required by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history records check.
- 14 (c) In accordance with §§ 10–201 through 10–228 of the Criminal Procedure 15 Article, the Central Repository shall forward to the Board and to the applicant the criminal 16 history record information of the applicant.
- 17 (d) **[**(1) Beginning January 1, 2015, the Board shall establish a rap back 18 program through which the Central Repository reports all new and additional criminal 19 history information to the Board for an applicant who has been fingerprinted in accordance 20 with the requirements of this section.**]**
