2 General Assembly – Fiscal Notes – Environmental Impact Statements

- FOR the purpose of requiring that a fiscal note for a bill include an environmental impact
 statement that indicates whether the bill may or will have an environmental impact
 and, if so, specifies the type and category of environmental impact; requiring the
 Department of Legislative Services to determine the type and category of
 environmental impact by completing a certain part of a certain form; and generally
 relating to environmental impact statements in fiscal notes.

15 WHEREAS, Numerous scientists and experts have labeled climate change a global 16 emergency; and

17 WHEREAS, Maryland has been a leader in protecting and promoting sound 18 environmental policy; and

19 WHEREAS, The federal National Environmental Policy Act and its statewide 20 counterpart, the Maryland Environmental Policy Act, were developed to enable informed 21 decision-making and environmental review; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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1 WHEREAS, The Maryland Environmental Policy Act requires State agencies to 2 prepare an environmental effects report on each "proposed State action significantly 3 affecting the quality of the environment" to protect the health of people and planet; and

WHEREAS, The proposed State actions for which an environmental effects report must be prepared are limited to "requests for legislative appropriations and other legislative action that will alter the quality of the air, land, or water resources"; and

7 WHEREAS, The environmental impact statement would complement the health 8 impact assessment tool to result in a systematic method of gauging the complete picture of 9 environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, The environmental impact statement should result in an improvement of the quality of relevant actions by calculating the long-term effects of a legislative proposal; now, therefore,

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - State Government

17 (e) (1) A fiscal note for a bill shall contain an estimate of the fiscal impact of 18 the bill on the revenues and expenditures of the State government and of local 19 governments:

20 (i) during the year in which the bill is to become effective and the 21 next 4 years after that year; and

(ii) if the full fiscal impact of a bill is not expected to occur during
those years, during each year until and the first year during which that impact is expected
to occur.

25 (2) If a bill, as introduced or amended, imposes a mandate on a local 26 government unit, the fiscal note for the bill shall contain:

(i) a statement that clearly identifies the imposition of the mandate;and

(ii) an estimate of the fiscal impact of the mandate and, if applicable
and if data is available, the effect on local property tax rates.

(3) If a bill, as introduced or amended, requires a mandated appropriation,
 the fiscal note for the bill shall contain:

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(i) a statement that clearly identifies the imposition of the

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1 mandated appropriation; and

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(ii) an estimate of the fiscal impact of the mandated appropriation.

3 (4) (I) A FISCAL NOTE FOR A BILL SHALL INCLUDE AN 4 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT THAT:

5 **1.** INDICATES WHETHER THE BILL MAY OR WILL HAVE AN 6 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT; AND

7 2. IF SO, SPECIFIES THE TYPE AND CATEGORY OF
8 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT, INCLUDING ANY IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT FROM
9 CLIMATE CHANGE.

10 (II) THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES, IN 11 CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT OR ANOTHER 12 AGENCY WITH RELEVANT EXPERTISE, SHALL DETERMINE THE TYPE AND CATEGORY 13 OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT BY COMPLETING PART II OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL 14 ASSESSMENT FORM THAT IS USED TO DETERMINE WHETHER A STATE AGENCY IS 15 REQUIRED TO PREPARE AN ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS REPORT UNDER § 1–304 OF 16 THE NATURAL RESOURCES ARTICLE FOR A PROPOSED ACTION.

17 [(4)] (5) A fiscal note shall identify the sources of the information that the 18 Department used in preparing the estimates of fiscal impact.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 2019.
