1 AN ACT concerning

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Election Law - Registration and Voting at Precinct Polling Places

FOR the purpose of providing an exception to the voter registration deadline to allow an individual to appear at a precinct polling place in the individual's county of residence and apply to register to vote or change the voter's address on an existing voter registration; requiring an applicant for voter registration on election day to provide proof of residency; specifying the acceptable forms of proof of residency; requiring an election judge to determine whether an applicant for voter registration resides in the precinct and is qualified to become a registered voter; requiring an election judge to process certain applicants for voter registration in a certain manner; requiring local boards of elections the State Board of Elections to take appropriate measures to notify
