- FOR the purpose of repealing the termination date for a provision of law that increased the maximum civil penalty for a violation recorded by a school bus monitoring camera for failure to stop for a school vehicle operating alternately flashing red lights; and generally relating to civil penalties for violations recorded by school bus monitoring cameras.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 18 Article - Transportation

- 20 (a) If a school vehicle has stopped on a roadway and is operating the alternately
- 21 flashing red lights specified in § 22–228 of this article, the driver of any other vehicle
- 22 meeting or overtaking the school vehicle shall stop at least 20 feet from the rear of the
- 23 school vehicle, if approaching the school vehicle from its rear, or at least 20 feet from the
- 24 front of the school vehicle, if approaching the school vehicle from its front.



- 1 (b) If a school vehicle has stopped on a roadway and is operating the alternately 2 flashing red lights specified in § 22–228 of this article, the driver of any other vehicle 3 meeting or overtaking the school vehicle may not proceed until the school vehicle resumes 4 motion or the alternately flashing red lights are deactivated.
- 5 (c) This section does not apply to the driver of a vehicle on a divided highway, if 6 the school vehicle is on a different roadway.
- 7 (d) A person convicted of a violation of this section is subject to a fine not 8 exceeding \$1,000.
- 9 21-706.1.
- 10 (a) (6) "Violation" means a violation of § 21–706 of this subtitle.
- 11 (e) (1) Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 12 officer at the time of the violation, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (h)(5) of this 13 section, the driver of a motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if the motor vehicle is 14 recorded by a school bus monitoring camera during the commission of a violation.
- 15 (2) A civil penalty under this subsection may not exceed \$500.
- 16 (3) For purposes of this section, the District Court shall prescribe:
- 17 (i) A uniform citation form consistent with subsection (f)(1) of this section and § 7–302 of the Courts Article; and
- 19 (ii) A civil penalty, which shall be indicated on the citation, to be paid 20 by persons who choose to prepay the civil penalty without appearing in District Court.

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017. [It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2019, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]
