A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County – Video Lottery Terminals – Distribution of Local Impact Grants

FOR the purpose of requiring at least a certain amount of certain local impact grants distributed to Prince George's County from certain proceeds of video lottery terminals to be distributed to the Town of Forest Heights; and generally relating to the distribution of local impact grant funds in Prince George's County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – State Government

21 9–1A–31.

(a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (8) of this subsection, the local impact
 grants provided under § 9–1A–27 of this subtitle shall be distributed as provided in this
 subsection.

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1 The following amounts shall be distributed to the following (2) $\mathbf{2}$ jurisdictions: 3 (i) Allegany County – \$200,000; 4 Cecil County – \$130,000; (ii) Town of Perryville - \$70,000; and $\mathbf{5}$ (iii) 6 Worcester County - \$200,000. (iv) The remaining funds for local impact grants shall be distributed in the 7 (3)8 following manner: 9 (i) 82% to the local jurisdictions with video lottery facilities, based 10 on each jurisdiction's percentage of overall gross revenues from video lottery terminals; and 11 (ii) except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, for 12operations at a video lottery facility starting in fiscal year 2012 and ending in fiscal year 132032, 18% to Baltimore City with the Pimlico Community Development Authority acting as the local development council in accordance with subsection (d) of this section, to be 1415distributed primarily for capital projects benefiting economic and community development in the following manner: 16 171. at least 75% in a manner that is consistent with the Park 18 Heights Master Plan; and 19 2.the remainder dedicated to the needs of: 20А. any census blockgroup that Baltimore City identifies as 21being located partly or entirely within 1 mile of Pimlico Race Course but not within the 22boundaries of the Park Heights Master Plan in a manner that is consistent with adopted 23neighborhood priorities; 24B. any neighborhood included in the Northwest Community 25Planning Forum Strategic Neighborhood Action Plan in a manner that is consistent with the adopted Northwest Community Planning Forum Strategic Neighborhood Action Plan 2627priorities; and 28C. beginning after a video lottery operation license is issued 29to a video lottery facility in Baltimore City, any neighborhood within an area bounded by Liberty Heights Avenue, Northern Parkway, Druid Park Drive, and Wabash Avenue in a 30 31manner that is consistent with adopted neighborhood priorities. 32(4)Of the amount specified under paragraph (3)(ii) of this (i) 33 subsection:

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1 \$1,000,000 shall be provided annually to Prince George's 1. $\mathbf{2}$ County to be used for public safety projects in the community within 5 miles surrounding 3 Rosecroft Raceway, OF WHICH AT LEAST \$120,000 SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS: and 4 $\mathbf{5}$ 2.\$500,000 shall be provided annually for impact aid to be 6 distributed as provided under § 11–404(d) of the Business Regulation Article to help pay 7 for facilities and services in communities within 3 miles of the Laurel Race Course. 8 (ii) The Legislative Policy Committee shall report its findings and

9 recommendations concerning the advisability of the continuation of the distribution of 10 funds after fiscal year 2032 to the Comptroller and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of this 11 article, the General Assembly, on or before November 1, 2030.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 13 1, 2019.
