
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## Pedestrian Safety Fund Act of 2019

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the minimum fine that may be imposed for a violation of 4 certain provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law regarding crosswalks; establishing 5 the Pedestrian Safety Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; requiring the Secretary of 6 Transportation to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the 7 Fund separately, and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the 8 contents of the Fund; specifying the purpose for which the Fund may be used; 9 providing for the investment of money in the Fund; requiring interest earnings of 10 the Fund to be credited to the Fund; exempting the Fund from a certain provision of 11 law requiring interest earnings on State money to accrue to the General Fund of the 12 State: defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Pedestrian Safety Fund.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2019.
