- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

17 (a) A person may not refuse or fail to leave a public building or grounds, or a 18 specific part of a public building or grounds, during the time when the public building or 19 grounds, or specific part of the public building or grounds, is regularly closed to the public 20 if:

(1) the surrounding circumstances would indicate to a reasonable person that the person who refuses or fails to leave has no apparent lawful business to pursue at the public building or grounds; and

1 (2) a regularly employed guard, watchman, or other authorized employee 2 of the government unit that owns, operates, or maintains the public building or grounds 3 asks the person to leave.

4 (b) A person may not refuse or fail to leave a public building or grounds, or a 5 specific part of a public building or grounds, during regular business hours if:

6 (1) (1) the surrounding circumstances would indicate to a reasonable 7 person that the person who refuses or fails to leave:

8 [(i)] 1. has no apparent lawful business to pursue at the public 9 building or grounds; or

10 [(ii)] 2. is acting in a manner disruptive of and disturbing to the 11 conduct of normal business by the government unit that owns, operates, or maintains the 12 public building or grounds; and

13[(2)](II) an authorized employee of the government unit asks the person14to leave; OR

(2) THE PERSON HAS BEEN SERVED A COURT ORDER, A TRESPASS
WARNING, OR ANY OTHER OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT DOCUMENT PROHIBITING THE
PERSON FROM RETURNING TO THE PUBLIC BUILDING OR GROUNDS, OR A SPECIFIC
PART OF THE PUBLIC BUILDING OR GROUNDS AT THE TIME OF THE VIOLATION.

19 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 20 is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2019.
