1 AN ACT concerning

State Department of Education – Nonprofit Youth Development Program – Established

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Nonprofit Youth Development Program in the State $\mathbf{5}$ Department of Education; establishing the purpose of the Program; requiring the 6 State Superintendent of Schools to develop and administer the Program; requiring 7 the Governor to include a certain appropriation to the Program in each annual 8 budget submission beginning in a certain fiscal year requiring funds for the Program 9 to be as provided in the annual State budget; requiring a certain nonprofit 10 organization to submit a certain application to the State Superintendent to apply for grants from the Program; requiring the State Superintendent to review certain 11 12applications and award certain grants in a certain priority; requiring a certain 13 percentage of grant funds to be awarded to certain programs; limiting the amount a grantee may be awarded each year; requiring the State Superintendent to adopt 14 certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to grants to 1516 nonprofit organizations to support youth development programming.

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1 (III) DEVELOP MEANINGFUL BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS THAT 2 IMPACT THE LIVES OF YOUTH;

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(IV) IMPROVE YOUTH SKILLS IN TECHNOLOGY; AND

4 (V) ENGAGE YOUTH IN MEANINGFUL AND PRODUCTIVE 5 ACTIVITIES.

6 (C) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL DEVELOP AND ADMINISTER THE 7 NONPROFIT YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

8 (D) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE 9 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET SUBMISSION AT LEAST 10 \$1,000,000 FOR GRANTS PROVIDED THROUGH THE NONPROFIT YOUTH 11 DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FUNDS FOR THE NONPROFIT YOUTH DEVELOPMENT 12 PROGRAM SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET.

13 (E) (1) TO APPLY FOR A GRANT FOR A PROGRAM THAT FURTHERS THE 14 PURPOSE OF THE NONPROFIT YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, A QUALIFYING 15 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE 16 SUPERINTENDENT.

17 (2) AN APPLICATION SHALL INCLUDE:

18 (I) A DESCRIPTION OF THE SCOPE AND PURPOSE OF THE 19 PROGRAM;

20 (II) A BUSINESS PLAN THAT INCLUDES THE ESTIMATED TOTAL 21 COST OF THE PROGRAM;

22 (III) MEASURABLE OUTCOMES AND TIMELINES FOR THE 23 IMPLEMENTATION AND EVALUATION OF THE PROGRAM; AND

24 (IV) ANY OTHER INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE STATE 25 SUPERINTENDENT.

26 (F) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OR THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESIGNEE 27 SHALL:

28 (1) REVIEW GRANT APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED IN ACCORDANCE 29 WITH SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION;

1 (2) AWARD GRANTS TO QUALIFYING NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS 2 THAT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A GRANT TO FUND CAREER DEVELOPMENT, 3 ENTREPRENEURSHIP EDUCATION, OR TECHNOLOGY TRAINING; AND

4 (3) GIVE PRIORITY FOR GRANTS TO ORGANIZATIONS BASED IN 5 BALTIMORE CITY AND PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY SERVING AREAS WITH HIGH 6 CONCENTRATIONS OF AT-RISK YOUTH LIVING IN POVERTY.

7 (G) GRANT FUNDS SHALL BE AWARDED TO QUALIFYING NONPROFIT 8 ORGANIZATIONS IN THE FOLLOWING PERCENTAGES:

9 (1) 30% TO ORGANIZATIONS TO DEVELOP PILOT PROGRAMS THAT 10 ARE CREATED TO FURTHER THE PURPOSE OF THE NONPROFIT YOUTH 11 DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM; AND

12(2)70% TO ORGANIZATIONS TO FUND EXISTING PROGRAMS THAT13FURTHER THE PURPOSE OF THE NONPROFIT YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

14 (H) AN AWARD MADE TO A GRANTEE MAY NOT EXCEED \$50,000 EACH YEAR.

15 (H) (G) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO 16 IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October July 1, 2019.
