- 1 (a) In this division the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 2 (b) "Commission" means the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.
- 3 **28–102.**
- 4 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 5 INDICATED.
- 6 (2) "ADVANCED METERING INFRASTRUCTURE" MEANS SMART
 7 TECHNOLOGY THAT IS COMPOSED OF REMOTE TRANSMITTERS, TWO-WAY
 8 COMMUNICATION BETWEEN A UTILITY CUSTOMER'S PREMISES AND A UTILITY
 9 COMPANY THROUGH A WIRELESS NETWORK, AND DATA MANAGEMENT.
- 10 (3) "AUTOMATIC METER READING" MEANS THE AUTOMATIC
 11 COLLECTION OF DATA FROM A METER DEVICE AND THE TRANSFERRING OF THAT
 12 DATA TO A CENTRAL DATABASE.
- 13 **(B)** THE COMMISSION MAY NOT IMPLEMENT ADVANCED METERING 14 INFRASTRUCTURE.
- 15 (C) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION PROHIBITS THE COMMISSION FROM 16 IMPLEMENTING AUTOMATIC METER READING.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 18 (a) The Department of Legislative Services shall conduct a study comparing the costs and benefits of implementing advanced metering infrastructure or automatic meter reading by public water utilities.
- 21 (b) The study shall include:
- 22 (1) a summary of available reports on the topic; and
- 23 (2) a survey of the metering practices and recent investments of public 24 water utilities in the Washington, D.C. region, Maryland, and comparable large public 25 water utilities in the United States.
- 26 (c) On or before September 30, 2019, the Department of Legislative Services shall report the findings of the study to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2019. Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of

- 1 May 31, 2024, Section 1 of this Act, with no further action required by the General
- 2 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
