## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Maryland Stadium Authority – Baltimore Convention Facility – Renovation

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Maryland Stadium Authority to provide for the 4 renovation of the Baltimore Convention facility; altering the authority of the Board  $\mathbf{5}$ of Public Works to approve the issuance of certain bonds related to the Baltimore 6 Convention facility without receiving authorization from the General Assembly; 7 altering the requirement that the Authority, with certain exceptions, comply with 8 certain requirements to finance certain activities; altering the contents required in 9 a certain deed, lease, or written agreement with Baltimore City; altering the definition of "Baltimore Convention site"; providing that an agreement entered into 1011 between Baltimore City and the Authority in accordance with the provisions of this 12Act shall supersede certain prior agreements; and generally relating to the Maryland 13 Stadium Authority and the Baltimore Convention facility.

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1 (a) Except as allowed by § 10–639 of this subtitle, to finance site acquisition [and], 2 construction, AND RENOVATION, the Authority shall comply with this section.

3 (b) The Authority shall provide to the fiscal committees of the General Assembly, 4 at least 45 days before seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for each bond issue 5 or other borrowing, a comprehensive financing plan for the relevant segment of the facility, 6 including the effect of the financing plan on financing options for other segments of the 7 facility.

8 (c) The Authority shall obtain the approval of the Board of Public Works of the 9 proposed bond issue and the financing plan.

10 (d) The Authority shall secure a lease or other written agreement with Baltimore 11 City, as approved by the Board of Public Works, under which:

12 (1) Baltimore City agrees to pay \$50,000,000 for the capital costs of the 13 expansion of the Baltimore Convention Center not later than the date of the Authority's 14 bond issuance as authorized under § 10–628 of this subtitle;

15 (2) Baltimore City and the Authority each own a 50% leasehold interest as 16 tenants in common in the improvements comprising the existing Baltimore Convention 17 Center and the Baltimore Convention Center expansion for the duration of any bonds 18 issued as authorized under § 10–628 of this subtitle; and

19 (3) Baltimore City and the Authority agree not to sell, assign, mortgage, 20 pledge, or encumber the Baltimore Convention facility, or any leasehold interest in the 21 facility, without the prior consent of the other, except for liens in favor of their respective 22 bondholders.

(e) The Authority shall secure a deed, lease, or written agreement with Baltimore
 City, as approved by the Board of Public Works, authorizing the Authority to:

(1) design and construct, or contract for the design [and], construction, OR
 RENOVATION of, the Baltimore Convention facility; and

(2) pledge the Baltimore Convention facility and the Baltimore Convention
site or the leasehold interest in the facility as security for the Authority's bonds.

(f) The Authority shall secure a written agreement with Baltimore City, asapproved by the Board of Public Works:
