1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Continuing Care Facility for the Aged**
3 **License**

4 FOR the purpose of specifying that a continuing care facility for the aged license in Harford
5 County is issued to the officers of the facility, rather than for the use of the facility;
6 and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Harford County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

20 22–102.

1 This title applies only in Harford County.

2 22–1002.

3 (a) There is a Class CCFA (continuing care facility for the aged) beer, wine, and
4 liquor license.

5 (b) The Board may issue the license [for the use] **TO THE OFFICERS** of a
6 continuing care facility for the aged that:

7 (1) provides continuing care as defined under § 10–401 of the Human
8 Services Article;

9 (2) is licensed as a related institution under Title 19, Subtitle 3 of the
10 Health – General Article;

11 (3) is certified by the Department of Aging; and

12 (4) is exempt from federal income tax under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal
13 Revenue Code.

14 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor on the
15 licensed premises for on–premises consumption.

16 (d) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor for on–premises
17 consumption during the hours and days as set out for a Class C beer, wine, and liquor
18 license under § 22–2004 of this title.

19 (e) The annual license fee is \$5,000.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
21 1, 2019.
