32 WHEREAS, During the 2016-2017 school year, Maryland public schools identified 2,337 unaccompanied homeless students who lacked stable housing, were not in the 33 physical custody of a parent or guardian, and were not under the care or custody of a 34

- child-serving public agency: and 35
- 36 WHEREAS, Unaccompanied homeless minors are a largely invisible and highly 37 vulnerable population that often lacks access to safe shelter options and supportive services designed for youth: and 38
- WHEREAS. Without access to safe shelter options and supportive services designed 39 for youth, unaccompanied homeless minors are at risk for trafficking and other abuse, 40
