A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Facilities and Police Officers – Procedures – Immigration Status**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an employee or agent of a correctional facility from
4 detaining a certain person beyond a certain date or notifying federal immigration
5 authorities of certain information about a certain person except under certain
6 circumstances; prohibiting a police officer from inquiring about certain information
7 under certain circumstances; defining certain terms; making the provisions of this
8 Act severable; and generally relating to the procedures of correctional facilities and
9 police officers pertaining to immigration status.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article – Correctional Services**

12 1–101.

13 (a) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated.

14 (d) “Correctional facility” means a facility that is operated for the purpose of
15 detaining or confining adults who are charged with or found guilty of a crime.

16 **9–617.**

17 **(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS**
18 **INDICATED.**

19 **(2) “FEDERAL JUDICIAL WARRANT” MEANS A WARRANT THAT:**

20 **(I) IS ISSUED BY A FEDERAL JUDGE OR FEDERAL MAGISTRATE**
21 **JUDGE ON THE BASIS THAT THERE IS PROBABLE CAUSE TO BELIEVE A CRIME HAS**
22 **BEEN COMMITTED; AND**

23 **(II) AUTHORIZES FEDERAL IMMIGRATION AUTHORITIES TO**
24 **TAKE INTO CUSTODY THE PERSON WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE WARRANT.**

25 **(3) “STATE–LAW RELEASE DATE” MEANS THE DATE ON WHICH A**
26 **PERSON IS REQUIRED UNDER STATE LAW TO BE RELEASED FROM CONFINEMENT**
27 **FROM A STATE OR LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.**

28 **(B) AN EMPLOYEE OR AGENT OF A CORRECTIONAL FACILITY MAY NOT,**
29 **WITHOUT A FEDERAL JUDICIAL WARRANT:**

30 **(1) DETAIN A PERSON BEYOND THE PERSON’S STATE–LAW RELEASE**
31 **DATE; OR**

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1 (14) a member of the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning
2 Commission Park Police;

3 (15) a member of the Housing Authority of Baltimore City Police Force;

4 (16) a member of the Crofton Police Department;

5 (17) a member of the WMATA Metro Transit Police, subject to the
6 jurisdictional limitations under Article XVI, § 76 of the Washington Metropolitan Area
7 Transit Authority Compact, which is codified at § 10–204 of the Transportation Article;

8 (18) a member of the Intelligence and Investigative Division of the
9 Department;

10 (19) a member of the State Forest and Park Service Police Force of the
11 Department of Natural Resources;

12 (20) a member of the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police
13 Force;

14 (21) a member of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission Police
15 Force;

16 (22) a member of the Ocean Pines Police Department;

17 (23) a member of the police force of the Baltimore City Community College;

18 (24) a member of the police force of the Hagerstown Community College;

19 (25) an employee of the Warrant Apprehension Unit of the Division of Parole
20 and Probation in the Department; or

21 (26) a member of the police force of the Anne Arundel Community College.

23 **DURING A STOP, A SEARCH, OR AN ARREST CONDUCTED IN THE**
24 **PERFORMANCE OF REGULAR POLICE FUNCTIONS, A POLICE OFFICER MAY NOT**
25 **INQUIRE ABOUT AN INDIVIDUAL’S IMMIGRATION STATUS, CITIZENSHIP STATUS, OR**
26 **PLACE OF BIRTH.**

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if any provision of this Act or
28 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a
29 court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other

1 application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application,
2 and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 2019.
