- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a local licensing board the Board of License Commissioners 4 for Baltimore City from transferring a license to another person if the transferor has 5 until the resolution of certain pending criminal charges filed against the transferor 6 or disciplinary matters before the local licensing board; Board concerning the 7 transferor; altering the grounds for which a license holder or certain party may make 8 a certain request to the Board to extend the life of a license; authorizing the Board 9 to grant an extension that prolongs the life of a license beyond a certain period of 10 time under certain circumstances; exempting a license the transfer of which is prohibited under this Act from a certain provision of law concerning the period of 11 expiration of a license; and generally relating to prohibited transfers of local alcoholic 12 beverages licenses in Baltimore City. 13
