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Maryland Home Improvement Commission – Contractors and Subcontractors – License Suspension and Permits

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Home Improvement Commission to suspend 4 5 the license of a certain licensee if the licensee is found liable for failing to pay a 6 subcontractor, subject to certain hearing provisions; requiring the license of a certain 7 licensee to remain suspended until the licensee pays a certain amount of a judgment; 8 prohibiting a licensed contractor from surrendering a certain license or allowing a 9 certain license to lapse while the licensee is under a certain suspension except under certain circumstances; prohibiting the building and permits department of a county 10 11 or a municipal corporation from transferring or releasing a certain permit on receipt 12 of a certain statement; providing for the contents of a certain statement; authorizing 13 the building and permits department of a county or a municipal corporation to 14 transfer or release a certain permit on receipt of a certain authorization or after the withdrawal of a certain statement by a certain individual; requiring a certain 15 16 department to develop and make available to the public a certain form; making 17 conforming changes; and generally relating to licenses and permits for contractors 18 and subcontractors.

6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 11	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person must have a contractor license whenever the person acts as a contractor in the State.			
12	8–311.			
13 14 15	(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8–312 of this subtitle, the Commission may deny a license to an applicant, reprimand a licensee, or suspend or revoke a license if the applicant or licensee or the management personnel of the applicant or licensee:			
16 17	(1) fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a license for the applicant or licensee or for another person;			
18	(2) fraudulently or deceptively uses a license;			
19 20	(3) fails to give the Commission information required by this subtitle about an application for a license;			
21	(4) fails to pass an examination required by this subtitle;			
22	(5) under the laws of the United States or of any state, is convicted of a:			
23	(i) felony; or			
24 25	(ii) misdemeanor that is directly related to the fitness and qualification of the applicant or licensee to engage in home improvement services;

20 21 22	(C) (1) SUBJECT TO THE HEARING PROVISIONS OF § 8–312 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE COMMISSION SHALL SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF A LICENSEE WHO IS FOUND LIABLE IN A CIVIL ACTION FOR FAILING TO PAY A SUBCONTRACTOR.		
23 24	(2) A LICENSE SUSPENDED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL REMAIN SUSPENDED UNTIL THE LICENSEE PAYS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THE JUDGMENT.		
25 26	[(c)] (D) Instead of or in addition to reprimanding a licensee or suspending or revoking a license, the Commission may impose a civil penalty under § 8–620 of this title.		
27 28 29 30	[(d)] (E) The Commission shall consider the following facts in the granting, denial, renewal, suspension, or revocation of a license or the reprimand of a licensee when an applicant or licensee is convicted of a felony or misdemeanor described in subsection (a)(5) of this section:		

31 (1) the nature of the crime;

1	(2) the relationship of the crime to the activities authorized by the license;
2 3	(3) with respect to a felony, the relevance of the conviction to the fitness and qualification of the applicant or licensee to provide home improvement services;
4	(4) the length of time since the conviction; and
5 6	(5) the behavior and activities of the applicant or licensee before and after the conviction.

8 9 10 11	Unless the Commission agrees to accept the surrender of a license, a licensed contractor may not surrender the license nor may the license lapse by operation of law while the licensee is under suspension under § 8–311(c) of this subtitle.

13 14 15 16	(A) Except for a permit for a home improvement to be performed by a property owner, the building and permits department of a county or a municipal corporation may not issue a permit for a home improvement unless the permit includes the license number of a licensed contractor.
17 18 19 20	(B) (1) THE BUILDING AND PERMITS DEPARTMENT OF A COUNTY OR A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION MAY NOT TRANSFER OR RELEASE A PERMIT ISSUED TO A SUBCONTRACTOR ON RECEIPT OF A STATEMENT OF CONTRACTOR BREACH FROM THE SUBCONTRACTOR.
