A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study Health Care for Inmates in Correctional Facilities

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Health Care for Inmates in 4 Correctional Facilities; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task 5 Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, 6 but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task 8 Force to meet with a certain frequency; requiring the Task Force to report its findings 9 and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 10 11 Task Force to Study Health Care for Inmates in Correctional Facilities.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Health Care for Inmates in Correctional 15 Facilities.
- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) three members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 18 of the Senate;
- 19 (2) three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 20 the House;
- 21 (3) the Secretary of Health, or the Secretary's designee;
- 22 (4) the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services, or the 23 Secretary's designee;

- 3 (h) On or before December 31, 2019, the Task Force shall report its findings and 4 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 5 Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2020, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
