(a) Each State department, agency, or program listed or identified under
subsection (c) of this section shall take reasonable steps to provide equal access to public
services for individuals with limited English proficiency.
(b) Reasonable steps to provide equal access to public services include:
(1) the provision of oral language services for individuals with limited
English proficiency, which must be through face-to-face, in-house oral language services
if contact between the agency and individuals with limited English proficiency is on a
weekly or more frequent basis;
(2) (i) the translation of vital documents ordinarily provided to the public into any language spoken by any limited English proficient population that constitutes 3% of the overall population within the geographic area served by a local office of a State program OR A COUNTY BOARD, AS DEFINED IN § 1–101 OF THE EDUCATION
ARTICLE, as measured by the United States Census; and
(ii) the provision of vital documents translated under item (i) of this item on a statewide basis to any local office OR A COUNTY BOARD, AS DEFINED IN § 1-101 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE, as necessary; and
(3) any additional methods or means necessary to achieve equal access to
public services.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
