2 Primary and Secondary Education - Animal Welfare - Instruction, Living

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that certain schools provide instruction on the humane 5 treatment and protection of companion, domestic, and wild animals; requiring a 6 school that keeps a certain animal on the premises to provide an appropriate living 7 space for the animal that meets certain standards; prohibiting an individual from

8 feeding a live animal to another animal under certain circumstances; requiring that 9 an individual who violates a certain provision of law is guilty of a certain crime;

defining certain terms; and generally relating to instruction in animal welfare in 10 11 public and nonpublic schools.

24 WHEREAS, Instruction in the humane treatment of animals is an important part of 25 a student's education because students frequently encounter animals in their daily lives;

1 2 3	WHEREAS, A dedicated curriculum that teaches the benefits of humane interactions between humans and animals will encourage students to have compassion and empathy for all living things; and				
4 5 6	WHEREAS, Many teachers keep animals in their classrooms to educate students about responsible handling of animals, and the animals in those classrooms rarely receive adequate care or enrichment; and				
7 8	WHEREAS, Animals kept in classrooms are often subject to environments that cause the animal stress and anxiety; and				
9 10 11	WHEREAS, Students may learn an appreciation of and receive exposure to companion and wild animals in the classroom without exposing those animals to inadequate living conditions; now, therefore,				
12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 27 (C) (1) EACH SCHOOL THAT KEEPS AN ANIMAL ON THE PREMISES SHALL 28 PROVIDE AN APPROPRIATE LIVING SPACE FOR THE ANIMAL.

1 (2) THE LIVING SPACE FOR AN ANIMAL S	SHALL:
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- 2 (I) PROVIDE SUFFICIENT SPACE SO THAT THE ANIMAL MAY 3 ENGAGE IN NORMAL BEHAVIOR FOR THE SPECIES;
- 4 (II) HAVE PROPER VENTILATION, LIGHTING, AND 5 TEMPERATURE CONTROL FOR THE ANIMAL BEING KEPT;
- 6 (III) HAVE ADEQUATE FOOD AND CLEAN DRINKING WATER 7 ACCESSIBLE TO THE ANIMAL;
- 8 (IV) BE CLEAN AND MAINTAINED ON A REGULAR BASIS; AND
- 9 (V) BE LOCATED IN AN AREA THAT MINIMIZES THE STRESS OF 10 AND DISTURBANCES TO THE ANIMAL.
- 11 (D) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT FEED A LIVE ANIMAL TO ANOTHER 12 ANIMAL IN THE PRESENCE OF STUDENTS WHILE ON SCHOOL PREMISES.
- 13 (2) THE PROHIBITION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION
 14 APPLIES TO THE FEEDING OF AN ANIMAL THAT IS KEPT BY, ASSOCIATED WITH, OR
 15 SPONSORED BY A SCHOOL.
- 16 (3) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO VIOLATES PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IS GUILTY OF AGGRAVATED ANIMAL CRUELTY UNDER § 10–601 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
