CHAPTER	

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public School Students – Vision Services and the Vision for Maryland Program – Reporting

FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to coordinate with the Vision for Maryland Program to ensure that certain students are able to receive eye examinations and, if necessary, eyeglasses; requiring each county board or county health department to provide eye examinations for certain students; establishing the Vision for Maryland Program; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to carry out the Program in consultation with certain entities; requiring the Program to provide eye examinations and eyeglasses to certain students under certain circumstances; requiring certain services to be provided in a certain manner; authorizing the Program to receive funding from certain sources; requiring the Program to receive funding from certain sources; requiring the Program to receive funding from certain sources; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to jointly study and assess certain matters; requiring the departments to jointly report on certain matters to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to vision services for students in public schools.
