#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Volunteer Fire Company and Rescue Squads – Member Disability and Death Benefits – Appeals Process

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain members of a volunteer fire company or rescue  $\mathbf{5}$ squad and certain individuals who are denied payment of a certain disability or 6 death benefit by the Board of Trustees of the Maryland State Firemen's Association 7 to appeal the decision to a certain appeals panel; establishing a certain appeals 8 panel; establishing membership of a certain appeals panel; requiring the Chair of 9 the State Firemen's Association to notify a certain member or a certain individual of 10 the final decision of a certain board regarding payment of a certain benefit; 11 authorizing a certain member or a certain individual to appeal a final decision of a 12certain board under certain circumstances; requiring notification of certain persons 13 of the final decision of a certain appeals panel; providing for the timing and procedure for mailing and deciding a certain appeal; making stylistic changes; defining certain 14 terms; and generally relating to volunteer fire company or rescue squad disability 15and death benefits. 16

  - (2) A benefit under this section shall be paid:
- 4 (i) regardless of the district in which the beneficiary was disabled; 5 or

6 (ii) regardless of whether the beneficiary was disabled in this State,
7 Delaware, the District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, Virginia, or West Virginia.

8 (b) The Board shall pay a benefit under this section from the treasury of the 9 [Maryland State Firemen's] Association in the amount and in the manner that the Board 10 determines until the beneficiary is no longer disabled.

11 (c) The secretary of the Board shall add the name of each beneficiary under this 12 section to the Disabled Firemen's and Rescue Squadmen's List.

13 (D) ON A FINAL DECISION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF A 14 DISABILITY BENEFIT UNDER THIS SECTION, THE BOARD SHALL NOTIFY THE 15 MEMBER OF THE DECISION BY CERTIFIED MAIL, POSTAGE PREPAID, RETURN 16 RECEIPT REQUESTED.

### 17 (E) SUBJECT TO § 7–206 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A MEMBER WHO WAS DENIED 18 PAYMENT OF A DISABILITY BENEFIT UNDER THIS SECTION MAY APPEAL THE FINAL 19 DECISION OF THE BOARD TO THE APPEALS PANEL.

21 (a) (1) The Board shall pay death benefits under this section if a member of a 22 volunteer fire company or member of a volunteer rescue squad dies:

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- (i) as a direct result of actively participating in fighting a fire;
- 24
- (ii) while going to or from a fire;

(iii) while performing other duties necessary to the operation or
 maintenance of the fire company;

(iv) while actively participating in the ambulance, advanced life
support, or rescue work of a volunteer advanced life support unit or volunteer fire,
ambulance, or rescue company located in the State; or

30 (v) while providing emergency or rescue assistance, whether acting 31 alone or at the direction of or with a fire, ambulance, or rescue company or advanced life 32 support unit. HOUSE BILL 1261

1	(2) A benefit under this subsection shall be paid:
2	(i) regardless of the district in which the decedent died; or
$\frac{3}{4}$	(ii) regardless of whether the decedent died in this State, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, Virginia, or West Virginia.
5 6 7	(b) (1) The Board shall pay a benefit under this section from the treasury of the [Maryland State Firemen's] Association in the amount that the Board determines, but not less than \$2,000.
8	(2) The Board shall pay a benefit under this subsection:
9	(i) to the decedent's surviving spouse or dependent child;
10 11	(ii) if no individual is eligible under item (i) of this paragraph, to the decedent's surviving dependent parent;
12 13	(iii) if no individual is eligible under item (i) or (ii) of this paragraph, to each surviving child of the decedent in equal shares;

3 (E) SUBJECT TO § 7–206 OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS 4 DENIED PAYMENT OF A DEATH BENEFIT UNDER THIS SECTION MAY APPEAL THE 5 FINAL DECISION OF THE BOARD TO THE APPEALS PANEL.

7 (A) AN APPEAL AUTHORIZED UNDER §§ 7–202(E) AND 7–203(E) OF THIS 8 SUBTITLE SHALL:

9 (1) ON OR BEFORE 90 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF SERVICE OF THE 10 NOTIFICATION REQUIRED UNDER § 7–202(D) OR § 7–203(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE, BE 11 FORWARDED TO THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE 12 ASSOCIATION BY CERTIFIED MAIL, POSTAGE PREPAID, RETURN RECEIPT 13 REQUESTED;

14 (2) ON RECEIPT OF THE APPEAL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE 15 ASSOCIATION, BE FORWARDED PROMPTLY TO THE MEMBERS OF THE APPEALS 16 PANEL; AND

17 (3) BE HEARD AND FINALLY DECIDED BY THE APPEALS PANEL NOT 18 LATER THAN 90 DAYS AFTER THE APPEAL IS FORWARDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 19 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

(B) ON A FINAL DECISION BY THE APPEALS PANEL AFFIRMING, REVERSING,
 OR MODIFYING THE FINAL DECISION OF THE BOARD, THE PRESIDENT OF THE
 ASSOCIATION SHALL PROMPTLY NOTIFY THE MEMBER OR INDIVIDUAL AND THE
 CHAIR OF THE BOARD OF THE DECISION BY CERTIFIED MAIL, POSTAGE PREPAID,
 RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED.
