# Immigration Enforcement - County Boards of Education, Public Institutions of Higher Education, and Hospitals Public Schools, Hospitals, and Courthouses Policies

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education, public institution of higher 6 education, and hospital to establish a policy on or before a certain date that limits 7 immigration enforcement on the premises of the appropriate entity to the fullest 8 extent possible consistent with federal and State law based on certain guidelines 9 developed by the Attorney General; requiring the Attorney General, in consultation 10 with certain stakeholders, to develop certain guidelines on or before a certain date; and generally relating to policies on immigration enforcement by <del>county boards of</del> 11 education, public institutions of higher education, and hospitals public schools, 1213hospitals, and courthouses.

10(A) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE APPROPRIATE11STAKEHOLDERS, SHALL DEVELOP GUIDELINES TO ASSIST PUBLIC SCHOOLS,12HOSPITALS, AND COURTHOUSES TO DRAFT POLICIES THAT LIMIT CIVIL13IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES ON THEIR PREMISES IN ORDER TO14ENSURE THESE FACILITIES REMAIN SAFE AND ACCESSIBLE TO ALL, REGARDLESS OF15IMMIGRATION STATUS.

16(B)PUBLIC SCHOOLS, HOSPITALS, AND COURTHOUSES MAY ESTABLISH17AND PUBLISH POLICIES THAT LIMIT IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT ON THEIR18PREMISES TO THE FULLEST EXTENT POSSIBLE CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL AND19STATE LAW BASED ON THE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.
