15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 20 21	(a) In this section, "Christian Science nurse" means an individual who is registered as a Christian Science nurse in the Christian Science Journal of the Christian Science Publishing Society.

Performs medication technician tasks as a student while practicing

1 under the direct supervision of qualified faculty; or

- (6) Works as a principal or school secretary, does not administer medication as a routine part of the position, and has completed training by the delegating nurse for the occasion where the individual may need to administer medication in the absence of the nurse or medication technician.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall preclude a registered nurse [or], licensed practical nurse, OR ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE from delegating a nursing task to an unlicensed individual [provided that acceptance of delegated nursing tasks does not become a routine part of the unlicensed individual's job duties].
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2019.
