- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Public Safety

- 19 (a) This section does not apply to:
- 20 (1) a fire alarm, a smoke detector, a smoke alarm, or an ancillary 21 component that is:
- (i) electronically connected as a part of a listed centrally monitored
 or supervised alarm system; or

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(ii) capable of sending and receiving notifications by: 1 $\mathbf{2}$ 1. a low-power radio frequency wireless communication 3 signal; or 2.4 a wireless local area networking capability; or $\mathbf{5}$ (2)any other device that the State Fire Marshal designates as exempt 6 through the regulatory process. 7(b) On or after October 1, 2018, a person may not sell a battery operated smoke 8 alarm in the State for compliance with this subtitle unless the smoke alarm is a sealed, tamper resistant unit incorporating a silence/hush button and using one or more long-life 9 batteries. 10 11 9–109. 12A person may not knowingly violate this subtitle. (a) 13 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person who (b) (1)14violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 10 days or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both. 1516(2)A person who violates § 9–106.1 of this subtitle is subject to a fine not 17exceeding [\$1,000] **\$5,000**. 18 SECTION 2.
