## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Injuries Compensation Board – Claims – Electronic Filing**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a claimant to file a claim with the Criminal Injuries  
4 Compensation Board electronically in a certain manner; and generally relating to  
5 criminal injuries compensation claims.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

19 11–801.

20 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

21 (b) “Board” means the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board.

2 (b) (1) Claims shall be filed in the office of the Board:

3 (I) in person [or];

4 (II) by mail; OR

5 (III) ELECTRONICALLY, IN THE MANNER PROVIDED UNDER  
6 PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD.

7 (2) The Board shall:

8 (i) accept for filing each claim that meets the requirements of this  
9 subtitle and the regulations of the Board; and

10 (ii) notify the claimant within 10 days after receipt of the claim.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
12 October 1, 2019.
