A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Membership – Department of Juvenile Services State Advisory Board**

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the membership of the State Advisory Board for the
4 Department of Juvenile Services; requiring certain members appointed to the Board
5 from the general public to meet certain requirements; and generally relating to the
6 State Advisory Board for the Department of Juvenile Services.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Human Services**

15 9-212.

16 (a) The State Advisory Board consists of the following [19] **21** members appointed
17 by the Governor:

18 (1) one representative of the Department;

19 (2) one representative of the State Department of Education;

20 (3) one representative of the Maryland Department of Health;

- (4) one representative of the Department of State Police;
- (5) one representative of the Social Services Administration of the
of Human Services;
- (6) one representative of a private child welfare agency;

- (8) three representatives of the State judiciary;
- (9) one representative of the General Assembly recommended by the
the Senate;
- (10) one representative of the General Assembly recommended by the
the House; [and]

(11) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND STATE'S ATTORNEYS' ON;

(12) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND OFFICE OF THE
FENDER; AND

[(11)] (13) seven members of the general public.

(b) Of the seven members from the general public:

(2) [three] TWO shall:

20 (i) at the time of appointment to a first term, be at least 16 years
21 old and under the age of 25 years; and

22 (ii) include at least one individual who has been under the
23 jurisdiction of the Department; AND

26 (c) (1) The term of a member is 3 years.

27 (2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms
28 provided for members of the State Advisory Board on October 1, 2007.

(3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

(5) A member who serves two consecutive full 3-year terms may not be reappointed for 3 years after completion of those terms.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
8 1, 2019.
