SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

or the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the individual:

5 (1) has leukemia or prostate, rectal, throat, multiple myeloma, 6 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, brain, testicular, **BLADDER, KIDNEY OR RENAL CELL**, or 7 breast cancer that is caused by contact with a toxic substance that the individual has 8 encountered in the line of duty;

9 (2) has completed at least 10 years of service as a firefighter, firefighting 10 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member or in a combination 11 of those jobs in the department where the individual currently is employed or serves;

12 (3) is unable to perform the normal duties of a firefighter, firefighting 13 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member in the department 14 where the individual currently is employed or serves because of the cancer or leukemia 15 disability; and

16 (4) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, 17 volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member, has met 18 a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a firefighter, firefighting 19 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2019.
