CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship Program – Alterations to the Award of Scholarship Funds

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance in the Maryland 4 Higher Education Commission to select eligible applicants for the Maryland 5 6 Community College Promise Scholarship program, to the extent practicable, at each 7 community college based on each community college's proportionate share of a certain number of students; specifying that if an award recipient is eligible for a local 8 9 promise scholarship, an award under the program shall be credited to the tuition of 10 a scholarship recipient before the award of a local promise scholarship; defining a 11 certain term; and generally relating to the award of scholarship funds under the 12 Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship program.
